Meet the families that benefit from your participation:

Brian, a veteran and single Dad with a 16 year old son, Brennan, in DeKalb County Schools. Currently employed as an Engineer in Norcross, Brian is going through chemotherapy for lymph node cancer but is doing well and has minimal side effects from his chemotherapy. Brian recently was referred to a company that could use his skillset and he is going through the interview process now.

Jeniffer, a single Mom with an 8-year-old son, Elijah, who goes to North Fulton Schools. Elijah enjoys playing basketball and baseball. Jeniffer has a secure full-time job with Delta Dental, which she has had for two years. She is also working towards a Bachelor's degree in Human Resources. In spite of her steady employment, Jeniffer has had difficulty finding affordable housing and does not receive child support. She and Elijah have been living in hotels until they could find more affordable, permanent residence. Despite these challenges, she has been doing her best to keep life as normal as possible for Elijah.

Mary, a single Mom and her son Tyron. Tyron is enrolled at Dunwoody High School. Mary came to Family Promise as a referral with \$38 dollars, a cell phone that was cut off and an empty gas tank. They had been sleeping in their car for two evenings and had not showered. Family Promise paid to have her phone turned on and bought them a gas card. Tyron is enrolled in school although he is very behind in school. He will need tutors that are available to volunteer their time. He is 16 in the 9th grade and has a late birthday. They are hoping he will not have to be held back any further. Mary is unemployed but Family Promise will begin working with her soon to see what her skillset is and help her to find fulltime employment.
