Torah Insights

Moses took Joseph's bones with him, for he [Joseph] had adjured the sons of Israel, saying, "God will surely remember you, and you shall bring up my bones from here with you". (Beshalach 13:19) The *midrash* comments that the aforementioned verse highlights the righteousness of Moshe. While the nation was busy pillaging the spoils from the Egyptian homes, Moshe occupied himself with the *mitzvah* of gathering Yosef's bones to provide Yosef a proper burial in Israel. Commentaries question this *midrashic* teaching, for collecting the spoils from the Egyptians was also considered to be a *mitzvah*. G-d already promised Abraham many years earlier that upon leaving Egypt, the Israelites would leave with "great wealth" (*Bereishis* 15:14). Therefore, if collecting the spoils itself was a *mitzvah*, why does the Torah commend Moshe for gathering Yosef's bones instead? The answer suggested is that a *mitzvah* that requires sacrifice and results in the loss of money is considered to be of 'greater' significance than one which does not. Thus, Moshe's commitment to providing Yosef with a proper burial warranted greater praise, as it was a *mitzvah* that bore with it both considerable self-sacrifice and a resulting financial loss.
