May 18th: Lock-Down Drill

We will be holding a shul-wide drill in order to prepare for the unlikely event of an intruder in our building. The drill will be led by our CSS team. Here's what you may want to know:

Q: What will I need to do? How can I help make everyone safe?

 \circ Please follow the instructions of the CSS Team during the drill. They have been trained in security and have rehearsed this scenario.

Q: How does this impact our children in the building?

 $^\circ$ Our children's safety is a top priority. Youth groups leaders will be trained in lock-down procedures and leaders and children met the CSS volunteers who will ensure that the drill runs smoothly and successfully. Further, CSS volunteers will be on the third floor working with the youth leaders during the drill.

Q: What do I do if I see a flashing blue light in the ceiling? • A flashing blue light is a signal of potential danger. Please calmly proceed to a Safe Area (see below) and listen for instructions.

Q: Where are the Safe Areas? What makes them safe? • Main Sanctuary

- Lower Level: Beit Midrash and Social Hall
- Any room on Floors 2 and 3

• The Safe Areas put at least one locked interior door between you and an exterior door through which an intruder may enter. Please keep in mind that the safe rooms are only safe if the doors are able to close and lock. Towards that end door stops have been removed and members are asked to never place any chairs or other impromptu door stops that will prevent doors from locking in an emergency.

Q: What do I do if I sense a potential danger?

 \circ Pull one of the Blue Panic switches: this will summon the Police and cause the Blue Lights to flash, alerting others.

 $^{\circ}$ Please note the location of the Blue Panic switches on each floor.

Simple Choices Make Shopping More Sustainable

Look for paper products with recycled content: For example, recycled toilet paper not only saves trees, producing it uses half the water and generates half the hazardous pollutants of virgin toilet paper. And it only generates a third of the greenhouse gas emissions.

A few more ideas:

- Keep dishcloths and sponges on hand in the kitchen, instead of relying on paper towels.
- Replace paper napkins with cloth napkins.
- Use handkerchiefs, washcloths, and towels that can be laundered and reused indefinitely in place of one-and-done facial tissues.

Melanie and Bob were searching for a new home in the spring and summer of 2003 (remember that blackout?) as their oldest child, an 8th grader at the time, was in search for a high school. Upon their first visit to Riverdale and a Shabbat at HIR, they were so moved by the spirituality, warmth and acceptance in shul that they knew they had found their home. So they left Bay Ridge, Brooklyn with their three young children in tow, moved to what their uprooted oldest child called "Riverhell" and renovated what their youngest child called "the broken house".

Melanie has worked her entire professional life in textile design. Her first 20 years were in industry, designing Jacquard fabric for the transportation industry and later the wider commercial industry. She is now an instructor in FIT's textile department. While in Brooklyn she co-founded the Hebrew school at the Bay Ridge Jewish Center. She has used her design and color skills to make our Bayit more beautiful for the annual journal dinners. We estimate that our increased costs relating to security will be approximately \$36,000.
