FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

Last year we tried to organize a Congregational trip to Israel. Unfortunately, and to be honest a little disappointingly, it didn't happen. Having to call those who had signed up, some who were anticipating their first trip and others who recognized that at their age it might be one of the last times they could travel so far, and tell them that the trip was off was heartbreaking. Though I was giving them disappointing news, I also made a promise, try again we would, and we will. During the High Holidays we will talk more about Israel, with whats happening there, how we can approach it, why visiting and experiencing Israel as Congregation is <u>so</u> important. You'll be reminded that if you are curious and perhaps this year is different, we will be holding an interest and informational meeting on November 14th, with the hopes of fulfilling the powerful statement of L'shanah Haba'ah B'Yirushalayim, Next Year in Jerusalem!

Going to Israel as a Congregation or even on a family trip is a special, unique experience. I remember the first time I went to Israel, with my family in 1992. It was the first international trip that I or my siblings had taken, it was a chance for us to see the places we had learned about in school and synagogue, heard about in the stories from the Torah. Likewise, the next family trip there was incredible. But for me, and so many other Jewish kids and teens, Israel is also the first international trip they take without their parents. As a teenager I took two separate trips to Israel, my 8th grade day school trip and Ramah Seminar as a summer program. Whether it's a two-week trip as a 14-year-old, or six weeks as a 17-year-old, being in Israel with your closest friends is *nothing* like going with your parents! Not only is the experience of Israel different, the connection that you forge with the country, your friends and Judaism are wholly your own. Inspired and built on the values instilled in you, of course, but it is those memories and experiences, I believe, that form the bedrock foundation of a life-long love for and relationship with Israel.

So how do we provide this type of experience for our children? How do we find the not -so-inexpensive means of sending them on programs like Addlestone's 8th grade trip, Ramah Seminar or USY Pilgrimage? Because of our love for Israel, as a congregation and a community, I want to highlight two programs, one established and one new, that will help our congregation send all our children to Israel as teenagers for less than the cost of the actual round-trip plane ticket.

For a generation Synagogue Emanu-El has been a supporter of the Israel Education Fellowship Program (IEF) in partnership with Charleston Jewish Federation, and we are proud that we have more families participating in this program, by a wide margin, than any other synagogue in the area. This program *quadruples* the money that a family puts aside for a child's trip to Israel. Eligibility for the program begins when a child is in 3rd grade, when they enroll their family contributes \$200/child for seven consecutive years. At the end of each year we, as a synagogue match that donation and Federation matches both donations. By the end of the seventh year, a family has contributed just \$1,400, but the child has **\$5,600** (!) to use for an extended trip to Israel (and yes, it can be applied to the Addlestone Israel trip a year early!).

The second program is brand new to Emanu-El and starts this year. In partnership with United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism and RootOne, every bnai mitzvah will receive a \$3,000 voucher which can be used on the same, or different, Israel trip. Through these two incredible partnerships, Synagogue Emanu-El is helping to provide nearly \$9,000 to send our teens to Israel for incredible experiences.

We are grateful to our partners in these endeavors. Visiting Israel, loving and supporting Israel is like no other Jewish value. It is our religious homeland, a place where Judaism can be felt at every turn and in every season. As a congregation we will return

there, I hope you will join me and make it possible this coming year. In the meantime, let us celebrate the opportunities our congregation and community can provide every teenager and wish them all a *Nisiyah Tovah*, a safe trip to Israel and we can't wait to hear about your trip!






