FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

Chanukah is not my favorite holiday. It should be, not because of the presents or even the ability to claim that it is a mitzvah to eat fried food for eight days. Even more so, my favorite (non-religious) holiday of the year is the one we just celebrated, Thanksgiving. I do love the food of Thanksgiving, but more than that, I love that it is a "yom tov" where there are no "yom tov" rules. Everyone is taking a day to rest and spend with family. Everything feels different, special, and yet we can still watch TV and use our phones. In this same vein Chanukah should be my natural favorite holiday- all that delicious food and virtually no religious restrictions. Alas, as a kid it may have been my favorite, as an adult I've come to appreciate, and anticipate the rituals of our holidays. With Chanukah though, I've struggled. It's a Jewish religious holiday, but there are few religious restrictions, and sometimes it happens that it only feels like Chanukah at night. Of course, there is the fact that Chanukah in America today is seen as being in competition with Christmas, even further altering the feel and expression of the holiday.

Chanukah does have its beautiful moments. It is powerful to stand around the Chanukiah, singing the blessings with family and friends, lighting the candles and singing songs. What I have appreciated most about the holiday is that it is an annual reminder, for me, of how to continuously find new meaning in a holiday that I am not naturally excited for. Each year, as we start preparing for the holiday, I take moment to focus on one aspect, one ritual or even one rule of the holiday and figure out how it is that this year I can find meaning in something I would be almost completely ok with skipping.

It is actually this preparation that is one of my favorite rituals, albeit a personal one, of Chanukah and something that is a perfect expression of a core theme of the holiday itself. At some point, or perhaps more often than not, all of us struggle with the observance of a holiday. It might be the long hours of the High Holidays, the challenge of changing your diet for Passover or even trying to figure out why we are still sad about the Temple being destroyed 2000 years ago. Despite these questions or struggles, all of us, in our own way, engage with these rituals and traditions year after year and each time how we engage is up to us. Sometimes we choose to do the same thing year after year, other times we seek something new, a new interpretation, a new method of expression, a new ritual to perhaps once again form connection and meaning.

The very name of the holiday, Chanukah, comes from the act of *chanukat haBayit*, the rededication of the Temple. The Greeks didn't destroy our ancient Temple, but they did desecrate it, and once the war was won it became the Macabee's obligation to make the Temple ritually pure again. The Macabee's though didn't simply clean the altar or other ritual objects and anoint them with oil, a process that is laid out in the Torah. Rather, the Macabees removed everything from the Temple, they even dismantled the Altar, and remade everything- the Altar, the utensils for sacrifice, the showbread table, everything. The Macabees didn't just rededicate the Temple, they renewed it, rebuilt it, took it down to just a building and then remade it in a way that they could feel proud of it, that it felt holy to them and a place where they could feel a connection to God. The old, defiled trappings of the Temple could have worked again, but they would not have felt as the same, they could perform the rituals but they wouldn't inject the spiritual.

This Chanukah I encourage all of us to engage in this sacred act of *Chanukah*. Let this be a holiday not just of presents, lights, dreidels, latkes and sufganiyot. Let it be a holiday of rededication and renewal. Let it be a holiday in which we find new meaning and connection to the traditions, for this holiday and all the others, so that we may see God's miracles and feel God's presence as our ancestors in the days of old and now in this season.

FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

We have reached the time of the year when many individuals receive their "Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from retirement plans. This includes IRA's, 401(k), 403 (b), just to name a few.

As we wish to perpetuate the future of Temple Emanu-El and ensure adequate funding for programming and operations, the opportunity presents itself for you to donate a portion of your distribution to us. It can be structured to accommodate your wishes.

The rules for this donation strategy are:

- *You can donate up to \$100,000 to a qualified organization or charity (which we are)
- *Your "Qualified Plan Custodian" must arrange for the transfer of your funds
- *You are not allowed to claim the donation as a charitable deduction on your taxes
- *By decreasing your Required Minimum Distribution- the amount is not claimed as a Taxable Distribution

If you have questions, direct them to the office and a member of the Finance Committee will follow-up with you.

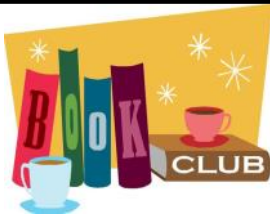

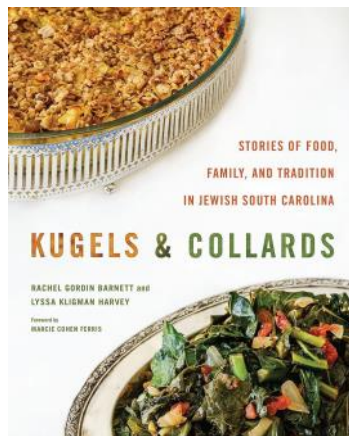

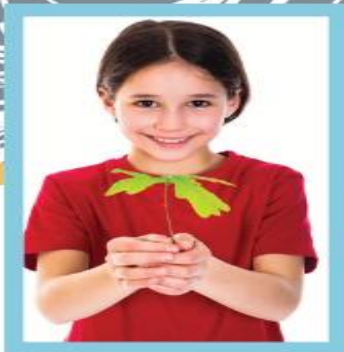
