FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

Starting a month ago, as the sun set on Purim, after a day of festivity and fun, our thoughts invariably turned towards Pesach. Each Year on Purim, the clock begins to count down, 4 weeks until the first Seder, until the house has to be cleaned, the dishes changed over and all the food prepared. We often fret these weeks before Passover because the task in front of us is quite monumental. The laws of Passover are some of the strictest and most serious around any holiday. We are meant not just to rid our homes of Chametz, leaven, but we can have nothing to do with it, we can't own it or benefit from it, we search for it by candle light, not because our ancestors lacked high-powered flashlights, but because the light of a single candle is dim and therefore ensures that we are looking closely, intently and slowly in each place. The process of removing Chametz from our homes takes over our lives, and kitchens, we pay ever more attention to the foods we buy before, and eat during, Passover.

When we look closely at the idea of chametz though, specifically at what happens if we transgress the biblical commandment, there is a completely other aspect to it. The punishment that the Torah metes out for eating chametz on Passover was that of Karet, of being cut off spiritually from the people of Israel, it's one of the worst and most severe punishments there is, you are exiled from the community, spiritually adrift. For the Rabbis it's a challenge, a physical act is punished in a strictly spiritual way. In response it is suggested that the meaning of chametz can, in part, transcend the physical form of leaven, of wheat, barley, spelt, rye or oats. What it can come to represent are the elements in our lives that act as fermenters, agents that turn things sour, even rotten. Leaven, yeast, if left unchecked can get out of control, causing chaos and very big and sticky messes. Chametz can represent for us, on that spiritual level, the things that hold us back in life, that make it difficult to connect with other people and with God. Passover then, becomes our opportunity, not just to rid our homes of bread and cereal products, but to also search our lives and our souls for those crumbs that need to be removed. Just as we have an imperative to remove chametz from our homes, the same is true in removing that which is holding us back from being our best selves. When we sit down on erev Pesach, we gather around the seder table, a word that literally means 'order.' It's not just the evening that has that specific order, but everything, by that moment must be 'in-order,' the table is set, the food cooked, house cleaned and perhaps most important of all is that we must have ourselves in order, we must be ready to envision ourselves as leaving Egypt once again.

Part of the ritual of preparing for Passover is to prepare not just your home, but yourself for the holiday ahead, for the journey that our ancestors took in the wilderness as they built and developed a relationship with God and the community as a freed people. This year, this Pesach, remember that before we sit down at the seder, we each need to have our minds and body in as much order as our homes, only then can we begin the journey to physical and spiritual freedom.

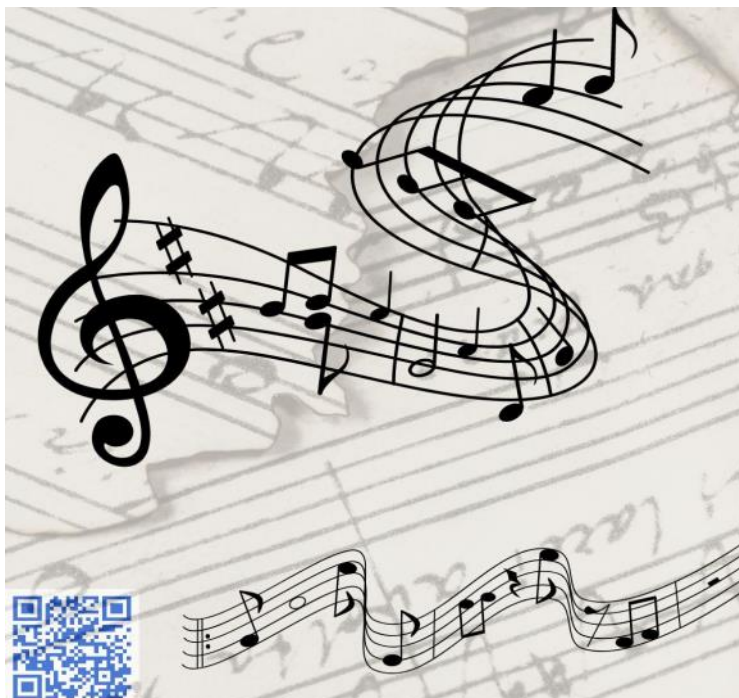

Fast of the Firstborn

The Fast of the Firstborn (Ta'anit B'chorim) commemorates the horrific tenth plague that God inflicted on Pharaoh and the Egyptian people. After Pharaoh again refused to let the Children of Israel go, Moses warned of the impending plague that would see the death of every first-born child in the land.

In recognition of this moment, when we are grateful the Israelite children were spared, we are also empathetic to the suffering of the Egyptians, and so first-born Jews fast on Erev Pesach.

Because this is a minor fast, the rabbis initiated the practice of holding a siyyum after morning services. As a celebratory moment, the siyyum overrides the minor fast, and those present are not required to fast for the rest of the day.

Therefore, any firstborn person present at our morning minyan and subsequent ten-minute siyyum may eat.
