**WE'RE GLAD YOU'RE HERE!**

- **Babysitting:** Available Saturdays from 9:00AM-12:30PM
- **Religious Garments:** As a sign of respect, a *kippah* (skull-cap) is worn by all males in the Synagogue. A *talit* (prayer shawl) is worn by adult Jewish males on Sabbath mornings; adult Jewish females are encouraged to wear a *talit* on Sabbath mornings as well.
- **Dress:** We ask all who attend to dress modestly, to reflect the sanctity of the Sabbath and the Synagogue. Additionally, everyone accepting honors must have their heads and shoulders covered.
- **Books:** The blue *siddur* contains prayers recited during the services. The red *chumash* contains the Five Books of Moses, with additional readings from the Prophets. Both are written in English and Hebrew and are read right to left. Both books are considered sacred, as they contain God's name.
- **Electronics:** The use of mobile phones, photographic devices, and writing implements are prohibited in the Synagogue on the Sabbath.
