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FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

Every holiday in the Jewish year has its own unique qualities and flavor. Each holiday focuses on different elements of life. Some are more concerned about our relationship with God, such as the High Holidays when we seek Divine forgiveness and mercy as well as the strength to be better in the coming year. Others are more centered on our relationship with the physical world around us, such as Sukkot when we concentrate on nature, whether using the Lulav and Etrog or sitting in the Sukkah. While every holiday of course has elements of both, Pesach is unique in the way it emphasizes a third aspect and value of our lives, education.

Like some holidays, Pesach emphasizes our relationship with God. The holiday requires that we tell the story of how God redeemed our ancestors from slavery and performed wondrous miracles for them during and after the Exodus. The Exodus and the miracles that were performed, we are reminded are examples of how God remembered us and the covenant that was made with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, this moment binds us to God and God to us. Yet like other holidays, Pesach also makes us keenly aware of the physical world around us, for example we have symbols on the Seder plate, the egg and parsley, which represent the changing season and the onset of Spring. Where we feel this impact on our daily lives the most however may be in fulfillment of one of the most pressing requirements of Pesach, completely removing Chametz, leaven, from our lives. We clean and search and sell and burn and nullify. We change dishes, cover counters and use different pots, pans and utensils, we eat different foods. In doing all of this we become hyper aware of our food and surroundings, of places we have checked and cleaned and places we haven't, of what we are eating and what others are eating as well.

Pesach though, strongly emphasizes one value more than other holidays, the value of education. The Haggadah may tell of the story of the Exodus, but it is framed by the Rabbis who are studying it, we read of their thoughts and recount the discussions that they had as well as the how it is that this story can be taught to different children and what lessons can be learned. We emulate the Rabbis of the Haggadah by making it an imperative not just to tell the story, but to teach the story of the Exodus. The Seder is constructed so that we, as participants, ask questions and have discussions. From the oldest to the youngest, everyone at the Seder table is encouraged to participate, not just by reading a paragraph of the Haggadah, but through questions, discussion, teaching and learning. The Seder plate and foods of Pesach encourage even more questions to be asked and lessons to be taught.

On Pesach we strive to connect with God and the world around us, but we also recognize learning and education is a value that is respected and treasured in Judaism, and without it Pesach, and the Seder, is just not complete. So, this year as we sit down around the Seder Table and prepare to tell the story of Passover, let us allow it to be a moment when one generation teaches the next about the Exodus, about family stories, traditions and holiday recipes. Let friends teach each other new ways to engage in the Seder, let children make us question time tested answers, and let our learning around the Seder Table deepen our love and commitment to those we love, God and Judaism. Chag Kasher Ve'Sameach and a zissen Pesach.

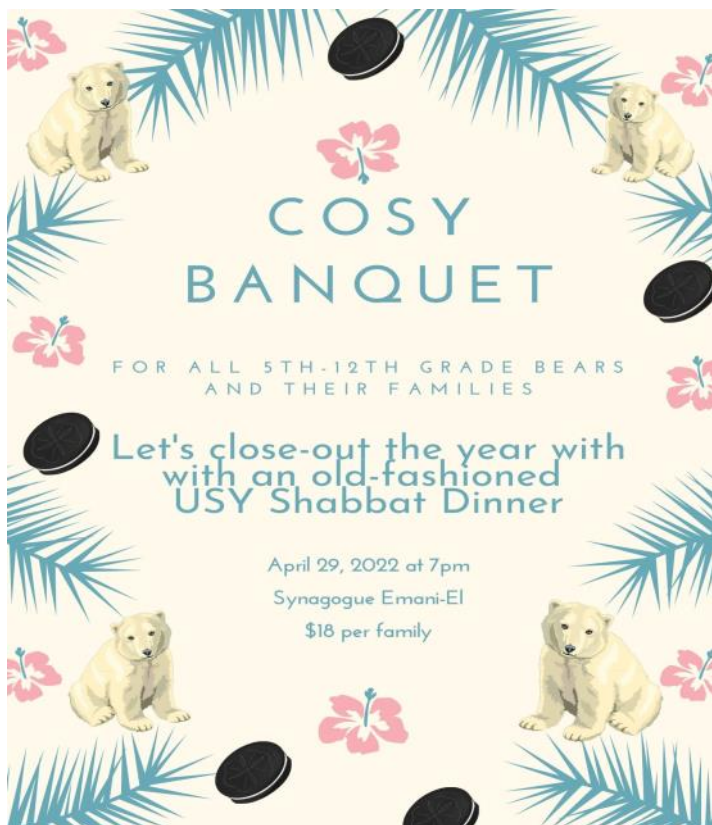

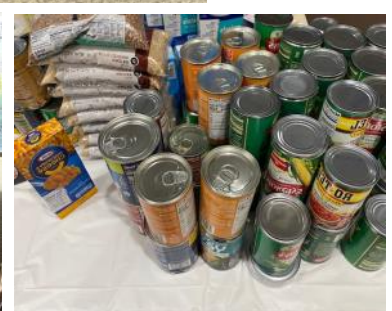
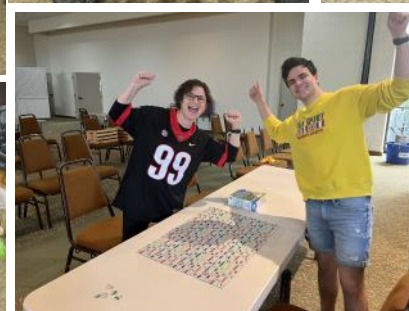

BIDIKAT CHAMETZ-THE SEARCH FOR CHAMETZ- The ceremony of the search for leavened bread, bedikat chametz, will take place this year on **Thursday, April 14th**, after sunset (Before the search, 10 small pieces of bread should be 'hidden' throughout the home. The pieces should be easily accessible and visible). Equipped with a lighted candle (or flashlight), a feather and a wooden spoon, go from room to room gathering the pieces of bread as a symbolic expression that the house has been cleansed of all Chametz and has been prepared for the holiday. **The next morning**, all the Chametz that was collected, along with the feather and spoon, should be burned no later than 12:00PM, the following day, **Friday, April 15th**. This ritual is a beautiful way for all who participate to begin the transition into Passover, recognizing that the house has been cleaned, chametz has been removed and that the next night (the Seder) will be different from all other nights. It's also a beautiful ritual and tradition that family members of all ages can participate. The prayers accompanying the search and the burning of Chametz can be found in the beginning of most Haggadot and Synagogue Emanu-El's Passover guide.

THE FAST OF THE FIRST-BORN: FRIDAY, APRIL 15TH AT 7:15AM- On Friday morning, April 15th, following Minyan which begins at 7:15AM, all first-born individuals are urged to attend a SIYUM BEKHOROT, a special study session marking the completion of a portion of study. Traditionally First-Borns fast the day before the first Seder in remembrance of the Tenth Plague, to show that we are grateful that God spared the Israelites from this plague and out of empathy for the Egyptian's loss. This fast can, however, be replaced by a study session followed by a seudat mitzvah, a celebratory meal for the completion of text study.

MECHIRAT CHAMETZ-SELLING YOUR CHAMETZ- Since it is not practical to remove all Chametz from our homes during Passover, Jewish law has provided for the sale of all Chametz for the duration of the Passover festival to a non-Jewish individual. The Chametz reverts to the Jewish owners at 8:45pm on Saturday, April 23rd, upon the conclusion of Passover. Rabbi Ravski will act as the agent to arrange this sale. In order to sell your Chametz, fill out the form below and send it to the Synagogue office. The form can also be filled out on our website. While there is no charge for the sale of Chametz, we encourage you to enclose a donation to Mazon, A Jewish Response to Hunger. **Please make checks payable to Mazon.**

A NOTE ABOUT KABBALAT SHABBAT FROM RABBI RAVSKI

Kabbalat Shabbat has been a beautiful time for us to gather and welcome Shabbat into our community. During the pandemic we continued this tradition by moving into a virtual space, finding ways to hold FNLs outdoors, adding programs like Wine and Cheese before services and Kabbalat Shabbat at the Beach during the Summer. We are excited for these programs to continue to flourish in our celebration of Shabbat.

While these programs have been a meaningful addition to our Shabbat observance, we have found that when Kabbalat Shabbat is just Kabbalat Shabbat, we have struggled to make a minyan, allowing us to welcome Shabbat with a full service and for those who need, to say the Mourner's Kaddish. Along with the Ritual Committee, we have made the decision to use April to help us reset our Kabbalat Shabbat experience.

We will still have Kabbalat Shabbat Services with Wine and Cheese on April 8th, and we will celebrate with Gavin Dempsy for his Bar Mitzvah weekend on April 29th. The other Friday nights of April we will be preparing for and observing Passover, and so we will not meet for Kabbalat Shabbat.

Then, starting in May, we will have Fridays with Wine and Cheese, FNL and Kabbalat Shabbat at the Beach. On the other Friday nights in May, we will have a Google Sign-Up for the service, so that we, the community and any mourners can be reassured that there is support from the community in our ability to hold a full service, including being able to recite the Mourner's Kaddish. If you're able to make any or all of these programs we can't wait to welcome in Shabbat together, and if you are, every so often, able to help us make a minyan on Friday night when there is no other program, the entire Emanu-El community thanks you.
