FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

The hottest days of August are still in front of us, and yet as this month begins and we commemorate the Summer holiday of Tisha B'Av, the day the First and Second Temples in Jerusalem were destroyed, our thoughts inevitably turn towards the coming Fall. Children will soon return to their classrooms, the Synagogue will again be a crowded place during the week, on Shabbat and on Sundays for Religious School. Of course, as the rhythms of the year pick up, we are keenly aware that the High Holidays are approaching.

Tisha B'Av, this year falls on August 6th-7th. It is described as the most sorrowful day of the year not just because both Temples were torn down, but our tradition places a whole host of other calamities as having occurred on this date. While we will gather together on Saturday night to chant Eichah, the Book of Lamentations, to remember what happened in the past, Tisha B'Av also looks towards the future in a way that is both subtle and beautiful.

To understand how a holiday that commemorates death and destruction can be a hopeful look to a better tomorrow, we must first understand two more things about the holiday. First, it falls exactly 7 weeks before Rosh HaShanah. The second is that while the Rabbis of our tradition are overzealous in their desire to add to the events that have befallen the Jews on this day, they also ask 'why'? Why is it that the Temple was destroyed? Rather than looking outward, the answer looks inward. The Temple was destroyed, we are told, because of Sinat Chinam, baseless hatred between people. If we take these two facts about the holiday together we begin to uncover that underlying message of Tisha B'Av as it prepares us to enter into the High Holiday Season. Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur are not holidays that stand alone. Entering into the Synagogue, beseeching God for forgiveness, pleading to be inscribed in the Book of Life and for a good New Year, can not be accomplished in a day or two or three. It takes weeks of introspection, of conversation, of seeking to make right any hurt we might have caused. Tisha B'Av reminds us to begin thinking about, and making amends for, those ideas now rather when it is too late.

The final verse of Eichah brings in to perfect focus the way Tisha B'Av looks both backwards at our history and towards our future. *Hashivenu Adonai v'nashuva, Chadesh yameinu ke'kedem*, Take us back Adonai, and let us come back, renew our days as of old. As the calendar and our thoughts begin to turn towards the New Year, we must begin working on the process of renewing ourselves, of making the days yet to come more like the biblical days of old, before baseless hatred had a foothold in our world. If we can accomplish this, then the New Year will truly bring a new day for us all. *Hashivenu Adonai v'nashuva, Chadesh yameinu ke'kedem*, Take us back Adonai, and let us come back, renew our days as of old.

TECHNOLOGY INFORMATION

ARE OUR EMAILS GOING TO YOUR SPAM?

Over the past few weeks, we've had a few congregants report that they aren't getting @emanu-el.com email. This has been both email from staff to congregants, and email sent through our mass emailer (Constant Contact).

We have worked closely internally and with our service providers to ensure our servers are tuned such that emails are less likely to be misinterpreted as spam.

After locating the email in question, which may sometimes land in the Junk/Spam folder, the two principles are to fixing the problem are to:

- Add the sender to your address book, *and/or*
- Mark it as not junk/not spam. Both should help solve the problem, though it can sometimes take mail systems a while to learn.

While we continue to tune up the servers (and in case it happens in the future), the information below may help Gmail, Hotmail, or Yahoo! users find the email and ensure delivery in the future.* Remember, one of the easiest ways to get basic help with technology is to search for your problem, e.g., *How do I find junk mail in my iPhone Gmail app?* or *How do I add someone to my Gmail address book?*
