



#### FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

Nes Gadol Haya Sham, a great miracle happened there. Each year as Chanukah approaches, we break out the dreidels in anticipation of the many dreidel-offs that will take place throughout the holiday as kids, and some adults, compete to win as much chocolate gelt as possible. The four letters on the dreidel, Nun, Gimel, Hay and Shin, are the first letters of each word of that phrase. Of course this always affords us the opportunity to break out the Israeli dreidels which read Nes Gadol Haya Po, a great miracle happened here. The difference of the dreidels make sense, given the phrase, the events, and miracles, of the Chanukah story took place in Israel and Jerusalem, and so it is us, living in the diaspora, who replaced the Peh for Po with a Shin for Sham.

Chanukah is a unique religious holiday in the Jewish calendar. It is the only non-Biblical holiday, meaning that there is no reference to it in any of our biblical texts. The ancient Rabbis are the ones who built Chanukah up into the fun, exciting and delicious holiday it is today, with a little help from being Americanized as a December holiday! Yet aside from the religious and ritual aspects that make this holiday different from all others, it is the phrase on the dreidel, more than anything that is striking. In all our other holidays we work to recreate the moment, to see ourselves as being there, reenacting it. We know this best, perhaps from the three Festival holidays (which we are learning about in this year's Festivals program). On Passover, we are meant to see ourselves as preparing to leave Egypt, the seder itself is in part a recreation of the meal described in the Torah the night of the 10th plague. On Shavuot we are meant to see ourselves standing at the bottom of Mount Sinai ready to receive the Torah, we even stay up late into the night in our excitement to receive it. On Sukkot we experience our ancestor's experience of living in tents in the desert by spending the week dwelling in the Sukkah. In these and all our other holidays, our tradition is designed to make us feel as though we are in that ancient moment, standing side by side with the multitude of generations that have come before us...except on Chanukah, when we in the diaspora celebrate what happened over there, without trying to see ourselves fighting side-by-side with the Maccabees, searching for oil, cleaning and rededicating the Temple. For us, not living in Israel, puts us as observers of the events of the holiday even as we celebrate them.

This though also gives us the opportunity to add yet another layer of depth and meaning to our celebration, just as the Rabbis of the 1st and 2nd centuries did when they began to celebrate Chanukah. Yes, we are the people who say Nes Gadol Haya Sham, and while we may be referring to the miraculous victory over the Assyrian-Greeks or the oil lasting eight nights instead of one, we can also be the people who say Nes Gadol Haya Po. This year, as we celebrate Chanukah, let us take time to recognize what miracles are happening here, in Charleston, that we can be part of. Whether it is participating in our annual Night of Giving or any other miracle that you help make happen. Chanukah celebrates a miracle elsewhere, but no matter where we are we remember it by lighting more and more candles each night, helping the light, warmth and goodness in this world grow throughout the holiday and winter. This year, join us, and all the Jewish people, as we celebrate the miracles that happened long ago there and the miracles that we make happen today and everyday here.





This past year Jasmine Hubara served as Southeast Fellow to our Partnership 2Gether region of Hadera-Eiron. We followed Jasmine's accomplishments as she fostered Israeli understanding of Conservative Judaism, specifically in the Southeast US. Amongst her many accomplishments, she started a group called Nashim. This group, which met monthly while she was in Israel, has transitioned to a monthly newsletter featuring women from our partnership in the southeast. If you know Jasmine, no job is ever done.
