FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

The old familiar greeting of “have a happy and healthy New Year” have returned to our greetings. Just 3 months after we celebrated the New Year, of 5782, as a congregation we again find ourselves looking forward to a new year, this time 2022.

We tend to see the Jewish and secular New Years at opposite ends of the spectrum. One is somber, focused on penance and prayer, the other brings to mind over the top celebrations, fireworks, ball drops, countdowns. It is true that the secular New Year presents itself as a celebration, the party of the year so to speak and that it takes a very different approach to the turning of the calendar than Judaism does when Tishrei arrives. Yet if we look deeper at the significance of the new year that is currently upon us, there truly is little difference between the two, they are after all, celebrating the same things- the opportunity to turn the page and start fresh, to make resolutions and try to make this year better than the last.

As December fades we tend to look back at the past year, the highlights and challenges, who we've lost and what we've gained. We look to see what progress we've made and what we still need to accomplish in the coming year. Then on the eve of the new year, we gather together, as friends, family, communities to welcome in the New Year with song and festive meals. Could this celebration be more Jewish? We observe Rosh HaShanah in the exact same way, just with a slightly different spin, and instead of counting down the last 10 seconds, we sound the shofar for the last 30 days, reminding ourselves that the New Year is coming.

In 2021 we learned a great deal about our community, about how we respond to difficulties, about our resilience, about our commitment to ensure a thriving Jewish community at Emanu-El and in Charleston. Yet we also recognize that it was a year for which we had high hopes when it began, and while we experienced miracles like the development of multiple COVID vaccines, we also recognize that those miracles are not yet complete. Rather than wallowing in our disappointment however, we still have hope for 2022, that perhaps this will be the year that a level of normalcy returns to our lives, that we will once again sit together in Adult Ed classes, at shul events, in services on Shabbat and Holidays, have kiddush luncheon even! Maybe this will be the year. Or maybe it won't. The uncertainty that surrounds us at Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur also exists in these opening days of January, there is so much promise and hope, as we say in the High Holiday liturgy, this year is pregnant with possibility.

The New Year, religious or secular, brings with it excitement, uncertainty, hope and anxiety for what is to come. And just like on Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur, the greatest blessing we have this January as we begin 2022 is that we will traverse all that this year will be together, as a family, as a community, guided by faith and Jewish values, so that whatever the New Year brings we face it as we should, together.


