

FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

The classic Rabbinic struggle with the holiday of Purim is that in all the books of the TaNaKh, the Jewish Bible, Megillat Esther is only one of two books where God is not explicitly mentioned (the other being Shir HaShirim, the Song of Songs). Commentaries and Midrashim have, for centuries, sought to find God's presence in the story. We read Mordechai's ominous warning to Esther that if she does not save the Jewish people then help will "come from somewhere else," and we claim that this is an allusion to God. The great Torah commentators wanted to see God in the story, they needed God to be in it, after all the TaNaKh is a record of God's interactions with our ancestors, the ways that God has supported us, protected us, at time punished us, and most of all saved us when it seemed all was lost. Yet in Megillat Esther we stretch our ability of interpretation in order to find God in the story, and when all else fails we simply say that God is hiding in the story, working behind the scenes to ensure a favorable outcome.

Read this way, the God in the Purim story might be the most relatable God that we have in all the TaNaKh. We live in a time after the prophets and kings, after the age of great and public miracles, we can't point to a single sacred building in Jerusalem and claim that God's presence is most focused there. Rather, God, as in Megillat Esther, works behind the scenes of our lives. We see God's miracles in different ways and at different times and know that the Divine is present in our world and our lives but in a very different way than in the times of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. Most of all though, we know that like in the story of Purim, we are expected to take an active role in our destiny. God has given us talents, skills and abilities, but we must put them to the best possible use and take hold of the opportunities that are presented to us.

As we gather together to celebrate Purim, as we dress up in costumes, give gifts to one another and those who are in need and as we make a ruckus when a certain name is mentioned, we will be taking hold of those ancient Jewish rituals and recognizing the different ways that God is present in our world and the ways in which we experience God. Most of all we will be expressing that even in those moments when it is a challenge to see God's hand at work, we know that God's presence is brought into our world through our prayers and actions and our destiny is as much our own responsibility as it is God's.

Chag Purim Sameach! Happy Purim!

Kenny keeps a watchful eye over all enter doors while who our also providing a smile and a helping hand whenever needed. Security co-chair Al

SECURITY

Secure Community Network (SCN) and Synagogue Emanu-El: Behind the Scenes

I am no expert on Secure Community Network (SCN) and will likely miss some of the helpful actions that they are taking to secure the Charleston Jewish Community. What I can speak about is my experience with them and share with you exactly how they are helping Synagogue Emanu-El.

For those of you that do not know who they are, <u>SCN</u> is a nonprofit organization and is the official homeland security and safety initiative of the organized Jewish community in North America. Jason Roebuck is the Regional Security Advisor for South Carolina and for Synagogue Emanu-El.

Sharing of Information:

SCN provides monthly bulletins to Emanu-El's security team that contains National and International information verified by Law Enforcement regarding possible threats to the Jewish community at large. In addition to these bulletins, SCN provides specific information on people who live or may be tied to our area. Emanu-El's security team started a binder with pictures and information of these individuals who have express hatred or threats toward the Jewish community via social media or other means. Emanu-El's security team reviews these photos prior to working an event or service at the Synagogue.

Threat and Vulnerability Assessments (Physical facilities): SCN's Jason Roebuck visits Emanu-El's properties and conducts a walkthrough of the facility to determine how Emanu-El can make the buildings and properties less vulnerable to potential threats. This is done annually. This walkthrough is thorough and even includes a nighttime visit so that lighting is considered in the assessment. Without this document it is difficult to acquire security grants from the Department of Homeland Security.

Providing Training:

SCN has already provided security training for Emanu-El's staff and security team. Perhaps by the time you read this article you will have attended the Active Threat training on February 27, 2022 provided by Jason Roebuck and SCN. Emanu-El's staff and security team have already received the Situational Awareness training and the Active Threat training.

The Future

SCN is working on a communication system that would allow instant communication with the community in the event of an active threat situation in the area. This system is desperately needed and would help disseminate information quickly that could potentially save lives.

SCN is dedicated to the safety of the Jewish Community and their input has been extremely valuable to Emanu-El. SCN not only works well nationally but is meeting us locally to share practical safety measures that will translate to real life situations.



HIDE: If you cannot get away safely, find a place to hide. Get out of the shooter's view and stay very quiet. Silence your electronic devices and make sure they won't vibrate.

Lock and block doors

Close blinds, and turn off the lights

Do not hide in groups—spread out along walls or hide separately to make it more difficult for the shooter Try to communicate with police silently— TEXT 911- text messages or put a sign in an exterior window Stay in place until law enforcement gives you notice that all immediate danger is clear


