FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

The Children of Israel have begun their march towards the Promised Land. On the 7th day of Passover I spoke, briefly, in services about how one of the things I love most about the Passover-Shavuot time of year, is that it is unlike any other holiday experience we have. While many of our holidays are about commemorating moments and events in our people's storied history, starting with Passover, we aren't just remembering or celebrating, we are experiencing the journey in real time with our ancestors. We sit with them on the first night, huddled in our homes as the 10th plague falls upon the Egyptians. We celebrate with them the next morning, singing Hallel as they exited slavery, and then starting on the second night we begin counting the Omer, the 49 days between liberation and revelation, that moment of reaching Mount Sinai and anticipating the receiving of the Torah. So much of our modern experience of Judaism is finding ways that rituals and prayers speak to us in this moment (this too is a beautiful aspect of our religion and allows the Torah itself to be a living document for every generation), we reinterpret and adapt to keep the traditions and understanding relevant and impactful. Yet at this time of year, while we may do that in some respects, we can not overlook that we are very much engaging in a real time journey with our ancestors, preparing to leave, counting the days until Sinai, staying up all night as we anticipate receiving the Torah. In this time of year, we don't just remember the experience of our ancestors, we actually walk with them for this part of their journey, and in doing so we create a bond, and experience, unlike any other.

There is truly nothing that compares to standing in the spaces of our history, Biblical and Modern. Being able to retrace the steps of our ancestors, touch the stones that are at the very bedrock of our faith while witnessing the modern Miracle of the Jewish State. We are blessed with a congregation here in Charleston that is engaged, connected and devoted to so many different values, traditions and practices of our religion. And while we can do so much as a community together here, there are somethings about Judaism that only comes alive, something about our Jewish identities that is ignited when we visit the Land of Israel. We, as a congregation and a community, are finally at a moment when we can return to Israel together. A moment when travel is safe, when Chanukah and school vacations in America line up, a time when we are looking to do something BIG after two years of being unable to do much.

Whether you've never been to Israel or haven't been in a while, come reignite your passion for and love of the country. Join us as we Light Up Israel and deepen our connection to the Land, to our religion and to our culture in a way that is possible nowhere else in the world like it is in Israel. The deadline to express interest or register for the trip is June 15th. Don't miss out on this truly incredible chance to experience Israel and engage with our history.

SECURITY

Synagogue Emanu-El: WORDS MATTER By Lisa Lambeth, Concealed 360, LLC (Synagogue Emanu-El's Security Consultant)

Words matter, especially when we are talking about a safety plan. For those of you who were not able to attend the first congregation-wide ACTIVE THREAT-EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN TRAINING last month I have some words for you. And for those of you who did attend, I have some reminder words for you. LOCK OUT and LOCK DOWN. These words are so important to Emanu-El's safety plan that we need to say them out loud, we need to think about them when we are at the Synagogue. But first we must understand what they mean. Your safety team has already said them out loud in training and they think about them every time they are on the property.

LOCK OUT: Lock out indicates that there is an active threat outside the building. The threat has not yet entered, and we need to keep them out. The security team and those who can help will begin verifying that all entrances are locked, all windows are locked, and all window coverings are pulled down or closed. We do not want the active threat to see inside the building. All the entrance doors at Emanu-El are designed to lock automatically once closed. That's why it is important that when any of us enter the building we make sure the doors close fully. If you hear the words LOCK OUT please repeat those words and help the security team by closing all blinds and windows. Stay in the building. Stay away from exterior glass and exterior doors like those in the atrium. Listen to instructions from the security team.

LOCK DOWN: Lock down means that there is an active threat in the building. The security team and you, depending on where you are, will need to lock all interior doors where people are hiding, close windows, and window coverings, turn your cell phone ringers and vibrators off. Call or text 911 if you are safe to do so. Do NOT assume someone else has done this. If you can get out of the building and are sure that you know the threat is not near you, then run. There are so many more details for you to hear and experience that cannot be printed in a simple article. We plan to offer another in-person Active Threat-Emergency Action Plan training session. These training sessions not only help you navigate threats at Emanu-El but will also help you in your everyday travels through life. Ask someone who attended the first session if it was worth their time.



HIDE: If you cannot get away safely, find a place to hide. Get out of the shooter's view and stay very quiet Silence your electronic devices and make sure they won't vibrate

Lock and block doors. Close blinds, and turn off the lights

Do not hide in groups—spread out along walls or hide separately to make it more difficult for the shooter Try to communicate with police silently— TEXT 911- text messages or put a sign in an exterior window Stay in place until law enforcement gives you notice that all immediate danger is clear
