FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

One of the most beautiful aspects of the Conservative Movement in Judaism is the way we strive to intertwine the different aspects of our lives, particularly to be Jewish in a modern, contemporary way. We can talk about being an American Jew or a Jewish American, but no matter how we put it, when it comes to our identities the basic truth is that both are just as central and essential to who we are, how we live our lives, the values we hold. At times we struggle with one or both of these aspects of our identities. The rise of antisemitism in America makes us feel like outsiders, when we are not. Every day, every moment can be a challenge to hold both these elements together, to reconcile them, to be comfortable with them and for them to be compatible.

We talk a lot about finding a balance between our 'Americanness' and our 'Jewishness,' yet if these two pieces of ourselves are inseparable, then it is not about creating balance between them, but speaking and acting in a way that authentically expressed both. Of all the moments in the year, it is this month of November that allows us to do this in two incredible, American, Jewish and holy ways...we get to vote and we get to eat.

Each year November allows us to cast our vote, to use our voice to help determine the future course of our community, state and country. We are blessed, as Americans, to live in a democracy that is constantly being reshaped by the will of the people. We have seen leaders and politicians of all stripes rise and fall, but our great State and Nation have persevered and grown with every election cycle. We are blessed, as Jews, that we have a unique perspective on America, on ideas, trends and issues that are rooted in sources different than mainstream America. We are blessed as Americans Jews that each year we have the right and obligation to vote for those we feel best represent our perspectives, values and way of life. As Jewish Americans we have a religious obligation to help appoint our leaders who we feel will best adhere to those values.

Then of course, we get to eat! At the end of the month we will celebrate Thanksgiving, the quintessential American holiday. On the fourth Thursday of every November, Americans everywhere sit down at their tables with family and friends and give thanks for what we have. While it is an American holiday, the values of Thanksgiving resonate so strongly with Judaism, as American Jews it is hard to not see it as a Jewish moment as well. Each day we give thanks in Judaism, from the moment we wake up and say 'Modeh Ani' thanking God for giving us this new day, to the moment we go to sleep. Family, friends, food, all of it is at the core of everything we do in Judaism, to the point that when we sit down this year on November 24th, it is hard to not see it as a sacred meal like the ones we share on Shabbat, Passover, Sukkot or any other holiday.

This month, let us celebrate all that it means to be bother Jewish and American. Let us use our voice to shape our State and Country. Let us sit down at our tables, over flowing with family, friends, food and love. Most of all, as we find that perfect blend of Jewishness and Americanness in our lives this month, let us be grateful for it all.

ANNE FRANK CENTER-BY BRENDA LEDERMAN



On Sunday, October 23, a small group from Synagogue Emanu-el took a trip to Columbia to visit the Anne Frank Center located on the campus of the University of South Carolina. This Center is the only one of its kind in North America and we have it here! It is not a replica of the house in Amsterdam. I, myself, have never been to Amsterdam, so I've never visited the Anne Frank museum there. My interest peaked the minute I heard that the Center Columbia opened in about а year ago. Our tour guide was the Director of the Center, Doyle

Stevick, Ph.D. Doyle is the reason that the Center is at USC,

since he was and is a professor there. The exhibit is full of photographs from Anne's life and relics of their time in hiding. He collaborates with the Anne Frank museum in the Netherlands. Through that partnership, the USC College of Education tours two exhibits about the life and times of Anne Frank in South Carolina schools.

None of this occurred in a vacuum. During the mid-late 1990s, Stevick was pursuing a doctorate in Greek and Latin literature and spending his summers excavating ancient sites in the Mediterranean, when encounters with racist extremism drove him to explore the power of education to undermine prejudice and foster tolerance. How could schooling support positive transformations? What cultural and social changes were necessary to fulfill these changes, and how might schools influence them? All of this led him to the field of Holocaust education. Doyle has traveled the world in the name of education. He is a top notch speaker, packed with information, who reaches the youngest of the group (Kesher) and the oldest (no names). How lucky are we?

We all left there feeling the huge impact of such a profound experience. I highly recommend this to you all and am happy to offer you any encouragement. A huge, huge thank you to the Engel Holocaust Education Fund for sponsoring our trip.

Macic VS: Miracles with Rabbi Ravski Wednesday: November 2nd & 16th @ 6:15pm

What is a miracle? What is magic? And what is the difference? Why does halacha, Jewish law, outlaw one while celebrating the other? And if magic is butlawed, then why do we see it over and over again in the TaNaKh and Rabbinic literature? This class will pull back the curtain on how miracles and magic are understood in Judaism.
