FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

As September begins all of us at the Synagogue truly begin to awaken from our Summer slumber. Religious school is back in session, adult education classes and Tikkun Olam programs are picking up. We are anticipating multi-generational programming like The Festivals. Yes, preparations for the High Holidays have already begun. There is one other program that we are all greatly anticipating which will begin this month and continue throughout the year. For the first time, Synagogue Emanu-El will have a Rabbinic Intern.

The genesis of this program comes from a number of places. It is a sign of how our Synagogue is growing, and places us among the leaders and innovators of the Conservative Movement. It allows our community to help mold future rabbinic leaders. While students learn a great deal in Rabbinical School, one of the most critical pieces is the experiences one has. I have told my story of when I entered Rabbinical School. I had no intention of going into the pulpit. It was only after I begun an internship, that my career path was altered (that 1-year internship ended up continuing until my graduation 3 years later).

Most internships are centered around the locations where the two Conservative movement Rabbinical Schools are located, New York City and Los Angeles. As a result, when students leave Rabbinical School, they have a strong understanding, and a lot of experience, in the Northeast or West Coast Jewish communities. What they lack is an understanding of what Jewish life looks like outside those regions, and how other Jewish communities create deeply connected and vibrant congregations just like ours.

At the start of this year, I brought this issue to The Jewish Theological Seminary (JTS) in New York. Synagogue Emanu-El made a name for itself during the pandemic as a shul that was thriving. Now, post-pandemic, we wanted to find a way to continue to be a leader in the Conservative Movement. With the leadership at JTS, we came up with an idea—an internship to bring a Rabbinical School student to our community. Once a month, this intern will not only get the experience of serving from a pulpit, but also be able to experience Jewish life outside the New York sphere of influence. The intern will also discover what it's like to be Jewish in the South and to help bring more innovative programs and education to our congregation. What's more, this is the first time that any synagogue in the Southeast is offering such an internship.

Today, I am excited not only to announce this Internship to the Synagogue, but to also introduce our first Rabbinic Intern, Micah Cowan. Micah will be joining us for the first time on the weekend of September 17th. He will be with us for the High Holidays and then once a month through May 2023. He will be leading from the pulpit, teaching in the Religious School, and on Zoom at different points of the year. He will take roles in Rabbinical responsibilities while he is with us. Please take a moment and read his article in the Scroll this month to learn more about him. Most of all, please join us for FNL on September 16th to welcome Micah, and throughout the year as he both teaches and learns from our Synagogue Emanu-El community and as we help shape the future of the Conservative Movement.

RABBINIC INTERN-MICAH COWAN

Shalom Synagogue Emanu-El! My name is Micah Cowan. I am a second-year rabbinical student at the Jewish Theological Seminary (JTS), and I am incredibly excited to be Emanu-El's first Rabbinic Intern.

I grew up in Rockville, MD, in the suburbs of Washington, D.C., where I was raised in a traditional Conservative home. I attended weekly services at our Conservative shul and attended the pluralistic Charles E. Smith Jewish Day School (CESJDS) for 13 years. In high school I went to Camp Ramah in New England and was a Szarvas Fellow at Camp Szarvas in Hungary. I was an active member of USY on the chapter, regional, and international levels, and have staffed USY summer travel programs five times. Two of those trips were on USY on Wheels: East, which made a stop in none other than Charleston, SC. While there, we were hosted by Emanu-El. I therefore am not a full stranger to the Charleston Jewish community but am eager to be fully immersed and involved.

After graduating from CESJDS I attended List College's Joint Program between Columbia University's School of General Studies and JTS. In college I was on the Conservative minyan's board, the artistic director of Shalhevet, the Columbia/Barnard's Israeli Dance troupe, and ran a challah business out of my apartment (Cowan's Columbia Challah, aka CCC). In the spring semester of my junior year, I studied abroad at Hebrew University through the Nachshon Project.

RABBINIC INTERN-MICAH COWAN

As a participant in this program, I was in a cohort of 40 students from across the Jewish religious and cultural spectrum with whom I was exposed to a range of potential career paths in the Jewish professional world.

Though there was always a piece of me that pulled me toward rabbinical school, Nachshon helped to solidify that plan. I graduated from List with bachelor's degrees in Linguistics from Columbia and Bible from JTS.

Post-graduation, I made a major move across the Atlantic to Budapest, Hungary. There I worked as a Jewish Service Corps (JSC) Fellow of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee. A few different responsibilities constituted my role: creating meaningful Jewish programming for BBYO Hungary; working in development and English editing for JCC Budapest – Bálint Ház; and being a generally positive and active member of the Budapest Jewish community. I spent four incredible months in Budapest before coming home to Maryland for the bris of my nephew, Aviv. Little did I know that a combination of visa issues and the ensuing pandemic would make those four months the only four months I would spend in Budapest as a JSC Fellow. Realizing that what I had hoped would become a 2-year job was being cut to less than half a year on the ground with no plan to return in sight, I found a job working for USY in logistics and operations in the fall. After a year working behind the scenes of USY, I found my way back to JTS, where I began rabbinical school last fall.

One of the most common questions I get asked as a rabbinical student, especially given the current market, is, "are you going to be a pulpit rabbi?" I always answer honestly and say, "at least for some time." It may be the case that my first job after ordination will be at a shul with which I will spend my entire career. I alternatively may be at a shul for a few years and realize I want to do something different with my rabbinate. I do know that in my future as a rabbi, I want to be interacting directly with people, not working behind the scenes. I believe that one of the settings where this is best achieved is the synagogue. This year, working with you, will be a taste of what pulpit work would look like, and I thank you for being a part of my journey to becoming a rabbi.

In this upcoming year I look forward not only to sharing all of these pieces of myself with you, but also to having you share who you are with me. As I visit, please come up and introduce yourself to me (you likely will have to reintroduce, as there is only one of me and hundreds of you!), because I believe the only way we can truly have an impact on one another is if we get to know each other. As much as I am excited to see what I will gain and learn from working with you this year, I cannot wait to contribute to the continual growth of Emanu-El this year.

ENTER INTO THE NEW YEAR WITH INTENTIONS

SELICHOT MOVIE NIGHT

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 17TH 8:15PM



Selichot is a prayer service composed of various psalms and poems said each night leading up to Rosh Hashanah. Unlike all other prayer services we have, Selichot has no fixed liturgy; it is an inspirational and aspirational way to begin the High Holiday season. The words of the individual psalms and poems are fixed, but the choice of which to include in the liturgy, in each service, is unique, depending on the day, the year, and the community. It is symbolic of how we should approach teshuvah (repentance) every year.



This year, our Selichot program will be held on Saturday, September 17th, at 8:15pm. As part of our program, we will view and discuss the film The Fisher King (1991), starring Jeff Bridges and Robin Williams. MY SUMMER IN ISRAEL BY JACOB KESTENBAUM

This summer I had the opportunity to go on a three week trip to Israel to play and teach the sport of lacrosse. It was a great experience where I made life-long friends and memories. This was a summer service trip through Israel Lacrosse for Jewish high school lacrosse players. The purpose of the service program is to introduce and teach the sport of lacrosse to the kids in Israel, and is called Sticks For Kids. Our group went to schools and camps in Israel and provided lacrosse instruction. We showed Israeli kids that there are options to popular Israeli sports like basketball and soccer.

I had a fun time showing the kids how to throw and catch the ball, along with passing and shooting. The kids always had smiles on their faces, and showed me that lacrosse isn't only about the game. Whether you're new to the sport or have been playing for years, it's about the community and there's a place for every individual. This is something I probably never would have realized had it not been for the amazing opportunity provided to me by Israel Lacrosse with the help of the IEF Program.

Along with lacrosse development in Israel, my group went to various destinations throughout the country. We went to the Western Wall, and were given a tour of the Old City of Jerusalem. One night we stayed in the Bedouin tents, and climbed Masada the next morning to see the sunrise and to learn about the history of the fortress. We also had the opportunity to spend a Shabbat evening with an Israeli host family. It was a little hard to communicate since we both didn't speak much of the other's language, but it was a very good meal and memorable experience. Overall the trip was both educational and a lot of fun. I had a meaningful time with the Israeli and American lacrosse community in Israel.

The Israel Education Fellowship program has a four step process that provides financial assistance to Jewish families in the Charleston area with children going to Israel. The first step of the process requires the parents of the child putting in \$200.00 for the first year of the fund. Then the family's synagogue then matches the fund. Once the donation is matched, the Charleston Jewish Federation doubles the match, 2 to 1, and the family continues this process for up to seven years. This seven year process costs the family only \$1400.00. Matching funds accrue to \$5600.00 used to supplement the cost of educational trips to Israel.

In summary, I am very grateful to my parents, Synagogue Emanu-El and the Charleston Jewish Federation for this program and the opportunity to visit Israel once again.
