RABBINIC INTERN-MICAH COWAN

I'm a sucker for a good story. I find that the best stories contain features like a well-developed plot that keeps me on my toes, characters that I can picture how they look and feel what they feel, and a meaningful message that I can take away from it. Whether these are personal anecdotes or published pieces of literature a good story can sit with you, resonate with you, have a greater impact on you in some way. But what if that story was riddled with falsehoods? Does that negate the power of the story at all? What if one of the largest, most complex, and most important books is full of impossibilities?

The Bible is rife with hyperboles, exaggerations, and numbers and situations that seem fairly improbable and impossible. Some of these cases are meant to emphasize that only God could make something so impossible happen. A donkey that opens her mouth and speaks to her rider Bil'am? Only possible because God gave her the power to communicate. Each of the 10 plagues – seemingly against nature, only God could make them happen.

Other kinds of hyperboles are seemingly possible, yet their magnitude makes them impossible. A flood is surely possible. But one with non-stop rain for forty days and forty nights? Less so. For this same length of time, Moses went up on Sinai, but didn't have anything to eat or drink – he surely should have died! Jonah was swallowed and later spit out by a large fish, but wasn't digested in its stomach? Something must be off. Perhaps these are exaggerations, or one could go as far to even say maybe they didn't happen, yet they aren't cut out or rejected from our tradition.

We still accept these stories as part of our canon of the Bible, as equally important to our tradition. We derive mitzvot from these stories, find meaning in their words, and inspiration from their morals. Just as this applies to these stories, it should also apply to the biggest farce in the Bible, the book of Esther.

True to the comical, satirical nature of Purim, the text of the book (really, novel) of Esther has absurdity at every turn. Achashverosh throws a feast for 180 days straight. Gallows that were 50 cubits (~75 feet) high for hanging Mordechai that Haman and his sons end up being hanged on instead. It's all quite ridiculous and ironic. Modern scholarship has gone so far to say that the Purim story, the book of Esther, doesn't actually have any historical basis. Given its absurdity, this is arguably reasonable and unsurprising. But the story of Esther, the triumph of the Jews over their adversaries, doesn't need to be true for us to gain meaning from it.

We learn to observe four mitzvot from Purim, four 'as. Hearing the Megillah, exchanging Mishloach Manot with our neighbors, enjoying a festive Mishteh (feast), and to give Matanot Le'evyonim (gifts to the poor). Whether or not the story of Esther is true, the values we can learn from the story still are just as important and valid. We should care for those around us – providing for those that we don't know who are in need and checking in and giving gifts to those whom we do. We should come together to celebrate with friends – celebrate and read the story, celebrate our people, celebrate our [manufactured] triumph.

So no, I don't think it matters that the story might not be true. Because it's a great story nonetheless. And who doesn't love some good satire?

SHABBAT MORNING 101

Shabbat morning services are the highlight of the week. Yet navigating the service, the prayers, and the choreography can be a challenge. Join Rabbi Ravski on two consecutive Wednesday evenings to learn about the *matbeah* (the order of the services) the choreography, and the intention behind the services. Following those two classes, we will then sit as a class together throughout Shabbat morning services with Rabbi Ravski acting as a guide through the service in real time. The goal of this class is to help those less familiar with the service to feel comfortable finding their way, while also giving those who already know the service a deeper understanding of


