

# FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

The Summer months bring with them an interesting stretch of time in the Jewish calendar. Throughout the year we talk about the cycle of holidays, how they reflect the seasons of the year. Yet in addition to the primary holidays there is another cycle that takes place. Often we over look these lesser known days as they carry with them few rituals and don't interrupt our week or our lives. The cycle is that of the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem. While this may seem like a somewhat morbid element in holiday cycle, or even inconvenient and burdensome at the idea that there are so many 'sad' days (all of which are minor fast days from dawn to dusk), I would like to suggest that it adds a beautiful aspect of symmetry to the Jewish holiday cycle.

We commemorate the destruction of both the 1st and 2nd Temples in Jerusalem on the 9th of Av, a day which we read Megillat Eicha, the Book of Lamentations, and fast. While Eicha is part of the biblical cannon, the commemoration of this event in our history as a holiday, is not. It is only in later generations that the Rabbis assign it such great significance. They make it a day of national mourning and elevate it to the only other full fast day in our calendar, putting it on par with Yom Kippur. While Tisha B'Av is a major holiday in the calendar, it does not stand alone. In fact there are three smaller days that mark the progression of the destruction of the Temples and Jerusalem. The first is the 10th day of Tevet, which falls in January, is the day the Babylonians laid siege to Jerusalem. The second, the 17th of Tammuz which this year is July 6th, marks the day that the walls of Jerusalem were breached. Three weeks later on the 9th of Av (July 26/27) is the day that both the 1st and 2nd Temples were destroyed. The final day in this cycle is the 3rd of Tishrei, right after Rosh HaShanah. It is known as tzom Gedaliah, the fast of Gedaliah. It commemorates the assassination of Gedaliah ben Achikam, the last independent and righteous governor of the Kingdom of Judah, four years after the destruction of the 1st Temple and the end of Jewish autonomy in Israel.

As I mentioned before, these four days are all recognized as sad, tragic days in our religious and national history. The destruction of the Temples and the loss of autonomy in Israel undoubtedly had a greater impact on our modern day practices than any other single event. Indeed, had the Temples not been destroyed, Rabbinic Judaism would not have developed in the same manner. Rather we would still be observing Judaism as a Temple-centered and sacrificial religion, offering animal sacrifices three times a year in Jerusalem. While this makes for good BBQ, I would argue its not the best practice of religion. Recognizing the significant impact the destruction of the Temples on Judaism is wholly appropriate then, as is, on some level, expressing sorrow that a way of life was lost. We can both appreciate modern Judaism and hold some measure of loss that how we practice is not completely the same manner described in the Torah.

Mourning the loss of Biblical practices though is only one part of this cycle, and I believe it can be understood in a second that connects the loss we feel to all the other holidays of the year. When we celebrate all our other holidays, with the exception of Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur, we always sing the Hallel prayer. Within that prayer we sing Zeh HaYom Asah Adonai Nagilah Ve'Nismecha bo, this is the day that God has designated for us to be joyous and celebrate. This emphasizes the fact that all our major holidays are intended to be festive and times of happiness. Wine flows freely because it is a symbol of joy, we sing and praise and relish the good in our lives, even on the High Holidays. What we end up with is one cycle of holidays that is pure celebration and another of commemoration, and together they enhance one another.

# FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

If our holidays were only joy, eventually that happiness would lose its context. Likewise, if we only remembered the difficult times it would seem as though it were all for naught, that there is no purpose. Rather the holiday cycle and the Tisha B'Av cycle work as a sort of Ying and Yang. The destruction of the Temples give context to our joy, and when we are sorrowful for the hardships and tragedies our ancestors have faced in every age, the holidays remind us there is joy to be found in the world.

This Summer may all of us find this type of equilibrium in our lives, allowing the good and the difficult to balance each other out, to use each moment to enhance the next rather than detract from it. And as we remember and mourn the destruction of the Temples, we let our souls be comforted knowing that the most joyous times of our year are only a few short weeks away.




