FROM THE DESK OF RABBI ROSENBAUM

In the 1967 film *The Graduate*, the main character, Ben Braddock, was given some famous career advice. “One word,” he was told. “Plastics. ... There’s a great future in plastics.”

Indeed, this was a prophecy that came true, and it is one that will impact our world for centuries. According to Alan Weisman, author of the book *The World Without Us*, almost all of the plastic that has been produced since World War II – at least one billion tons – remains on earth. Plastic debris is now the most common substance found on our oceans’ surfaces, threatening the health and livelihood of thousands of sea creatures, and contributing to the waste-management problem that continues to grow. Indeed, there’s a great future in plastics – a future with no end in sight.



If the Industrial Revolution opened doors that were never imagined by ancient humanity, then its side effects of mass consumption and immense waste may threaten to close the doors behind our children and their children. I know you’ve heard this before, and I recognize that not everyone agrees with the cynical predictions sounded by most environmentalists. But even if you don’t believe that our environment is fighting through a crisis, we can at least agree that wasting resources benefits no one, and only hurts us in the long term.

The principle of avoiding waste is a central Jewish idea. It is called *bal tashbit*, which means, “you shall not destroy.” And it applies not only to preserving our environment, and not only to economic concerns, but also to the way that we appreciate all of the gifts given to us by God. Rabbi Norman Lamm points out that the rabbis were struck by a verse in the book of Deuteronomy which describes the proper way to treat an area that has been conquered in warfare: “When you besiege a city a long time ... you shall not destroy the trees thereof ... you may eat of them, but you shall not cut them down ... you may cut down only the trees of which you know are not trees for food so that you may build bulwarks.” To the rabbis, the key to this passage was the idea that we should preserve a fruit tree, which continues to replenish itself and sustain the people around it.

They were also concerned with what the fruit tree represents – a symbol for all resources that we have the responsibility to not waste. The philosopher Maimonides summarized it by saying, “And not only fruit trees, but whoever breaks vessels, tears clothing, wrecks that which is built up, stops fountains, or wastes food in a destructive manner transgresses the commandment of not destroying.”

If the preceding paragraphs sound familiar to you, it’s because I’ve written them in this space before — in January 2011. The words are no less true than they were six years ago. However, in light of recent governmental decisions regarding climate change, I thought it would be appropriate to print them again. Because if our leaders decline to act when our ability to live on the Earth is in great peril, it’s up to all of us to do so. Don’t just take my word for it — you can find it in the words of our greatest scholars and teachers, as well as our sacred texts.

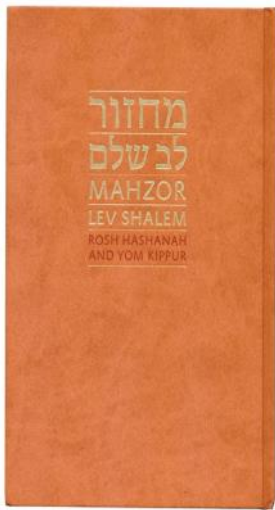

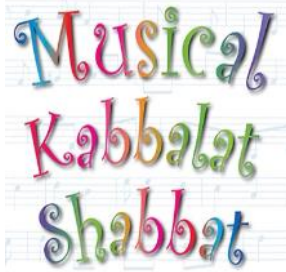
