FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

Perhaps it is because we find ourselves in the middle of the Sukkot holiday, but lately my attention has been focused on sacred spaces and gatherings. These past few weeks have been filled with incredible moments and examples, I hope that you've been able to be part of some (or all!) of them and if not there is still time! On Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur we gathered in our Sanctuary for three days of incredible community, prayer and spirituality. While the attendance through the various days and services waxed and waned, the energy in the room never dissipated. I believe this is because of the reason that all of us, any of us who gathered together were there for. When we come together for a single and united purpose, the sacredness of the space is magnified exponentially. September also brought the return of Religious School. Walking around the building on Sunday mornings is an absolute joy! To see and hear our school overflowing with children learning about and engaging in Judaism and Jewish values is one of the most beautiful aspects of any given weekend. And then there is Morning and Evening Minyan, a time when a handful of dedicated individuals show up for prayer, always hoping that a few more will join to help make a minyan. The sacred practice of starting or ending your day with prayer truly helps and nourishes the soul while also creating deep bonds amongst other minyanaires. If you haven't been to minyan in a while, join us and see how the blessing of prayer can impact your day.

This is why I love Sukkot, and why 'dwelling in the Sukkah' itself is such a powerful and important ritual. The Sukkah is like no other space in Judaism. It isn't permanent, no one has their regular seat, it's open and we feel vulnerable. At the same time, it is a deeply sacred space. The Sukkah doesn't just remind us of the huts our ancestors lived in while wandering the desert, rather it reminds us that when they were wandering the desert, they lived as a community in God's presence. Whether it was the pillar of cloud or fire, God's presence as a cloud over the Mishkan or the presence of the Ark of the Covenant and the Ten Commandments, when the Israelites lived in Sukkot it was a time of heightened connection with God.

In this modern age, while we may not feel as connected or close to God while spending time in the Sukkah (but I hope you do!), we do connect better with one another. For most of us, the Sukkah is a place where you get to share a meal, play a game, read a book. While some may be adventurous enough to bring a TV out to their Sukkah, it tends to be that the Sukkah is a place where there are few devices and distractions. We go into the Sukkah for a sacred purpose, to be with one another and yes, with God, in celebration of the holiday. In setting out with a single and united purpose of being in the Sukkah, we elevate the holiness of the space.

I hope that in the remaining days of the holiday of Sukkot you join us at the Emanu-El Sukkah, whether its for Ice cream on Monday, The Men's Club Brisket and Burbon on Tuesday, Sip and Study on Wednesday or just bring your own meal and enjoy time in the Sukkah on Thursday. Whatever it is that brings you into the sacred space, I hope you enjoy it and feel the beauty and power of God and community.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL



Kesher (7th-8th graders) Kesher will meet on Sundays at Emanu-El from 10:30am-12:30pm and will taught by Rabbi Ravski.

One of the most pivotal events for Jews in the 20th Century was the Holocaust. It altered the course of Judaism in a way perhaps not seen since the Spanish Inquisition or destruction of the 2nd Temple. Even four generations later the Holocaust remains as a wound, one that is healing, but is none the less raw. At the same time we have reached a critical moment post-Holocaust. Fewer and fewer Survivors remain and anti-Semitism in America is on the rise like never before. This year the Kesher Class will be examining the Holocaust in an age-appropriate approach. We will examine the origins of anti-Semitism, how it gave rise to Hitler and the Nazi Party and the near destruction of European Jewry. We will also hear stories from Survivors. Using critically acclaimed accounts such as Maus and Night, students will be given the space to ask questions, understand and process the experience of those who lived the events firsthand. In doing so we will work to achieve our primary goal of beginning to create new generation of witnesses to the Holocaust.
