

FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

Summer approaches, the hours of daylight are increasing, as is the humidity in the Lowcountry. The onset of Summer is noticeably felt in Judaism because of the role the sun plays in determining "Jewish time." On the Hebrew calendar, the new day begins at nightfall, when three stars are visible in the night sky. For holidays, such as Shabbat, we back this time up to just before sunset so that there is never a question of accidental trespass on the holiday. Even so, in Charleston in the Summer months, the average official start of Shabbat each week is sometime around 8:00pm. While it might seem inconvenient to begin Shabbat so late, or to think about first sitting down to dinner at that time, Jewish Law permits us to begin the celebration of Shabbat early. In doing so, we are able to celebrate Shabbat at a time when the restrictions of the day are not yet incumbent upon us. This allows us to be more flexible in the ways we can welcome Shabbat and the programs we can hold on Friday evenings.

Over the past three years we have used the late start time of Shabbat to help expand our Friday Night Kabbalat Shabbat Service with the addition of Kabbalat Shabbat at the Beach. This monthly program has brought us to beaches all over Charleston, where we gather to play and pray in the sand! We have regularly had 30-40 people at these services and look forward to seeing even more people this year as we head to the Isle of Palms County Park each month.

While playing and praying in the sand is fun, there is still more that we can do, still more that we want to do. One of my favorite stories from when we first moved the Charleston was that I had to go to the County Assessor's office, the city had mistakenly classified our home as a 'vacation home' for tax purposes and I needed to fix it. While standing in line, the person in front of me turned around and said "hello Rabbi, I have a question- what do you think about musical instruments on Shabbat?" in front of me was none other than Jacobo Mintzer, a past president of Synagogue Emanu-El. A wonderful discussion kept us occupied while we waited, and we parted with the hopes of finding a way that both guards the Sabbath and brings more musicality to our services. This Summer, thanks to the generous support of Federation, we will be experimenting with ways to bring more music into our Shabbat observances and services. Each month during the summer we will be bringing in an artist in residence. We will use the late starting time of Shabbat to allow for the use of Musical instruments during Kabbalat Shabbat and perhaps even learn a new tune or two to add to our repertoire. The first Musical Kabbalat Shabbat will be June 23rd, and we are excited that our very own Yuriy Bekker will be bringing his incredible talent to our sanctuary and our prayers.

So whether you love the beach and ocean or the beautiful, musical sounds of instruments, join us this Summer for Kabbalat Shabbat and more!

Techeilet: The Color of Tzitzit Sunday, June 4th @ 9:45am

Biblical blue color known as technilet.

Techeilet is best known as the color of tzitzit, the ritual fringes of a tallit. At the end of the class, we will learn how to tie tzitzit, and, for those who would like, a set of techeilet tzitzit can be purchased from Rabbi Ravski to add to and enhance your tallit.

*You do not need to purchase the tzitzit to join the class.


