## FROM THE DESK OF RABBI RAVSKI

November is one of my favorite months. As a New England native, I love the crisp autumn air, the cooling temperatures, the changing color of the leaves, the fall décor, and yes, the holiday music- Jewish and not. Even if the climate is not exactly the same here in South Carolina, this time of year is still my favorite. To go along with it, Thanksgiving is one of my favorite 'Yom Tovs,' festival days, of the year. Everyone, of all religions, races and backgrounds, take the day to be together, share a meal and be grateful for what we have in our lives.

While I am grateful for many things this year, this past month I find that more than ever I am grateful to be part of this incredible community. We came together at the High Holidays to celebrate together. The first day of Rosh HaShanah was like no other, with standing room only! Kol Nidre and Yom Kippur were powerful moments of prayer and when over 100 people gathered in our new Sukkah for dinner, it was truly a moment of finding ourselves in the shelter of God's presence. While the end of Sukkot is supposed to be a joyous time, it was shattered this year by the horrific attack on Israel. In those first days, without community, I am unsure how any of us could have made it through. Even as we still watch Israel's response unfold, even as we still pray for the safety and success of the IDF and her soldiers, even as we still mourn those who were lost that day and in the weeks since, we do so together, as a congregation, a community, as the People of Israel. We do these things together and it is why the cry of "עם ישראל חי" -Am Yisrael Chai" is so powerful, the People of Israel will always live because we do so for each other.

Perhaps the most powerful moment since the war began was when our entire community gathered together to stand with and rally for Israel. As a Synagogue we were honored to host the Charleston Jewish Federation's event, as a Jewish community we were proud to show our solidarity with Israel, call out barbaric terrorism and show gratitude as Americans for our country and governments (both Local and Federal) response. We also had a chance to thank Law Enforcement for their work and efforts to ensure a safe and secure Jewish community.

As I stood on the Bima, side by side with my Rabbinic colleagues, I couldn't have been prouder, or grateful. Proud that over 650 people gathered in our sanctuary and that we were able to provide the space for such a sacred community gathering. I was awed by the breadth of community members that came out, from every corner of the denominational spectrum, the Addlestone community, students from the College of Charleston, city officials and allies from the non-Jewish community. Most of all though I was grateful for those colleagues who stood with me, leading the Mourner's Kaddish. The Rabbinic leaders of this community who have helped shepherd the Jewish population of Charleston through so much grief and heartache while also lending their strength. In coming together, Rabbi Alexander (KKBE), Rabbi Perton (Addlestone) and myself represented our communities and helped show that this moment is above and more important than denomination. That unity and solidarity is a mitzvah, a commandment that rises above our other commitments and obligations, because Israel matters, because our united community matters. I am grateful that Rabbi Alexander was there to give us a blessing of peace and lead us in healing song, and I am grateful that Rabbi Perton, as the head of Addlestone, an Orthodox Rabbi and a father, shared his son's story and his family's experience. I am grateful that Addlestone has found such a considerate, thoughtful and passionate leader focused on creating community regardless of affiliation or denomination.

## A NOTE FROM MICAH COWAN

Dear Emanu-El,

While I am supposed to be spending this third year of rabbinical school in Jerusalem, due to the current war and recommendations from American authorities to not be in Israel at this time, I am writing to you from Budapest, Hungary. This is an incredibly complicated and difficult situation facing Israel, the global Jewish community, and the world at large, but amidst all of this, please know that I am safe and doing well. While I am not on the front lines fighting in the war, I found different ways to be able to contribute - I volunteered at an old-age home in Jerusalem that was severely understaffed and spoke with their English-only speaking residents, I stood in a 9-hour line to donate blood, and am now doing my best to help Israeli families in Budapest that are either stuck here or have escaped here as a result of the war. While the war feels so far away in Israel, I know it feels particularly close in our hearts. Personally, a former USYer I staffed is one of the soldiers who was kidnapped and taken to Gaza - his status still unknown. Even if we can't be there to fight the fight, directing our hearts to the well-being of those involved and supporting them in their efforts can both give us hope and solace and contribute positively to the greater cause. I continue to pray that this will end soon and Israel will once again be the calm, safe place we call an additional home.

Wishing you all comfort, hope, and peace as we embrace this difficult moment.
