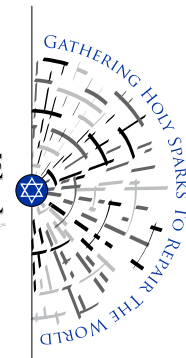

Dear Temple Solel Family,

I always love the springtime spiritual season - a cycle of new beginnings. It opens with a celebration of redemption and freedom as we walk forward during Pesach - culminating seven weeks later with our communal acceptance of Torah during Shavuot. A new beginning of freedom - journeying onward through the desert and sea toward the promised land; a new beginning of leadership - Moses is new on the job, and the people don't really know much about him yet; a new beginning intellectually and communally as we extend our arms to embrace the Torah - knowing almost nothing at the outset about what that entails exactly. Our tradition tells the story of us as a people who are usually game for new beginnings.

Right before the Ten Commandments are delivered atop Mt. Sinai, the Torah recounts that there are rumblings. Uncertainties. People are antsy as they prepare for a big moment. In the midst of these conditions, medieval French commentator Rashi emphatically

whispers, *Kol hatchalot kashot* - all beginnings are difficult. Rashi makes this statement right alongside a positive inspiration reassuring everyone that receiving Torah will be good and meaningful and delightful. And, yet. Beginnings are difficult.

I've come to interpret this ancient moment as a keenly insightful observation about transitions. All beginnings are difficult because they are also endings. Any time something new begins, something else ends. For me, that means parting ways with a very wonderful rabbinate in New Orleans - replete with connections and friendships and memories and familiarity. For you, saying farewell to Rabbi Frank and Rabbi Wright reflects a punctuation in time that was filled with connections and friendships and memories and familiarity.

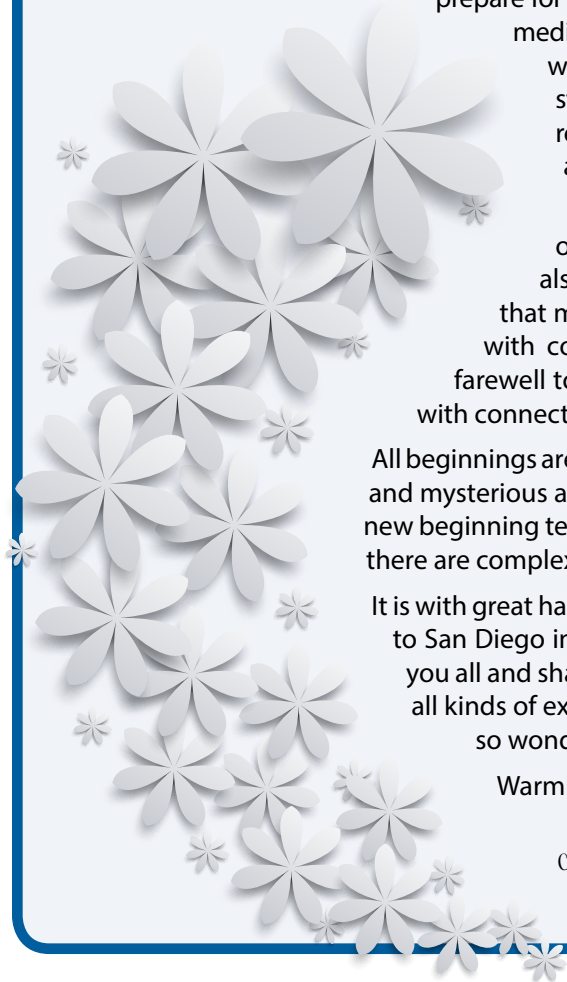
All beginnings are endings. And all endings are beginnings. And, it all feels joyous and unsettling and mysterious and glorious and uncertain - for all involved. I will hold your experience of this new beginning tenderly in my heart as we get to know each other, with the understanding that there are complexities to transition. There is holiness in these complexities.

It is with great happiness and eager anticipation that my family and I plan our move back home to San Diego in June. We are very excited about this new beginning. We can't wait to meet you all and share in the beauty and honesty of this transition together. Please stay tuned for all kinds of excellent fun our extraordinary staff team is planning for this summer. It will be so wonderful to see you in July.

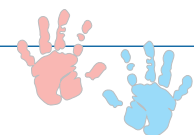

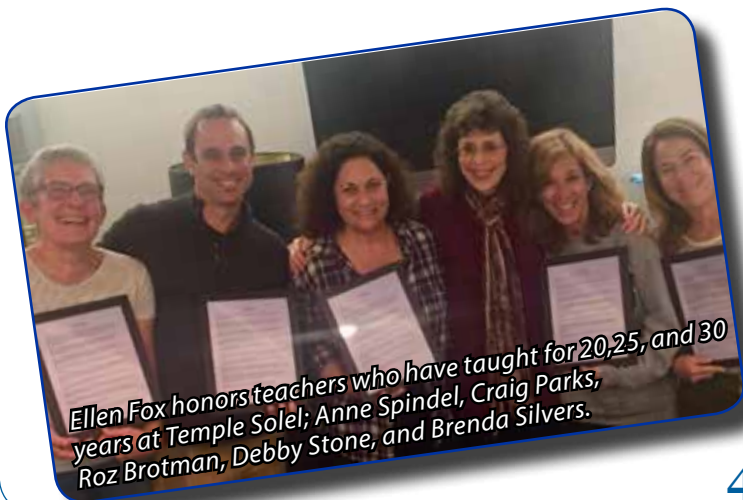

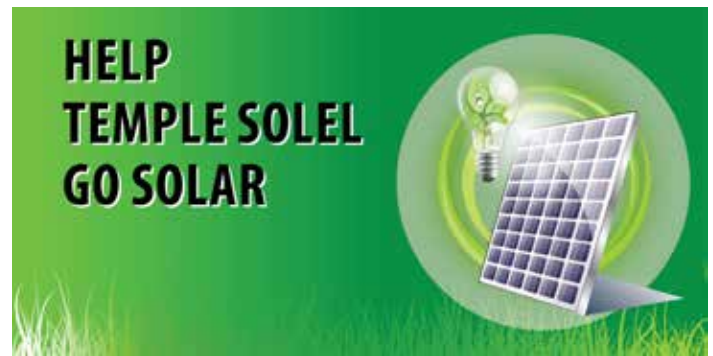

Dear Friends,

Temple Solel has an incredible opportunity to save money and the planet at the same time - but we need your help.

As you know, Temple Solel has been raising money through the Atideinu Campaign and, to date, has commitments of over \$2.5 million over 5 years. At the request of the donors, much of the funding is restricted for specific operational expenses temple will incur. The Board of Directors continues to explore options to remain fiscally responsible and get the best return on any investments or projects temple might under take.

The first investment the Board has approved is to install solar at Temple Solel. Solar will save our community approximately \$40,000 per year - and that number will grow as electric rates rise. The cost for our solar project will be \$385,000. As an added value, this includes a brand new roof for the entire campus. In addition to the over 10% return on investment, we can all be proud of reducing Temple Solel's carbon footprint.

The goal is to install solar in 2019 while remaining fiscally prudent. To do that, Temple Solel must raise enough money to keep a sufficient bank balance to be prepared for unforeseen expenses.

Here is where we ask for your help. If you've already made your Atideinu pledge and you would like to help with the solar project, please consider (1) increasing your pledge and/or (2) accelerating your pledge so Temple can use those funds now. If you haven't made a pledge yet, please join the many members who are participating.

So far, we have over \$250,000 in pledges approved for use on the solar project.

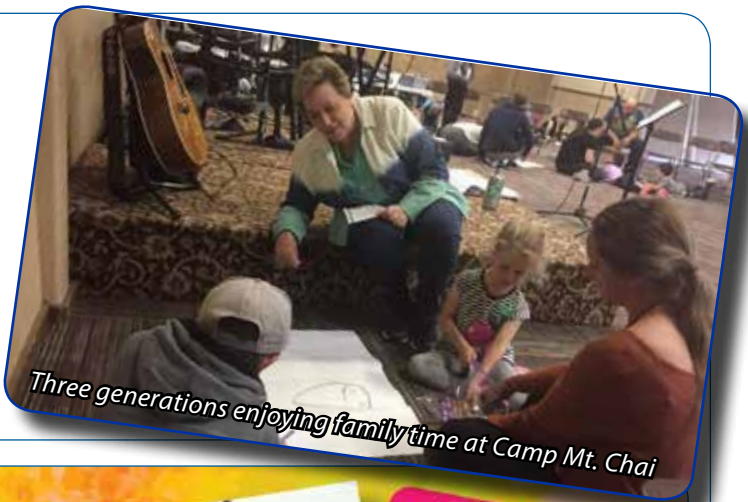
