Message from President Joanne Roberts

Having just returned from the Scheidt seminar – a special 3-day intensive educational course for temple presidents from reform synagogues around the country sponsored by the URJ, I could not wait to share some valuable lessons learned.

The central theme focused on sacred partnerships between clergy, leadership, staff, and congregants. "A sacred partnership is a commitment to building and nurturing relationships that elevate the work of leadership to a level of holiness. Sacred partners recognize each of us as individuals and our desire to inspire sacred action in our communities. Sacred partnerships are built and nurtured through the Jewish values of mutual respect, trust, honesty, listening and communication, transparency, confidentiality, flexibility, reflection, empathy, and vulnerability."

I ask each of you:

- How can we, the pillars of our synagogue, continue to create a spiritual home that envelops all those who yearn for community, connection, holiness, and learning?
- Who is accountable for the work?
- What is my personal responsibility?

Knowing that my answers could never be as wise, I turned to quotes from those past and present whom we respect and admire as well as text from the Torah.

- A community is too heavy to carry alone. Deuteronomy Rabbah 1:10


"How wonderful it is that nobody needs to wait a single moment before starting to improve the world." Anne Frank

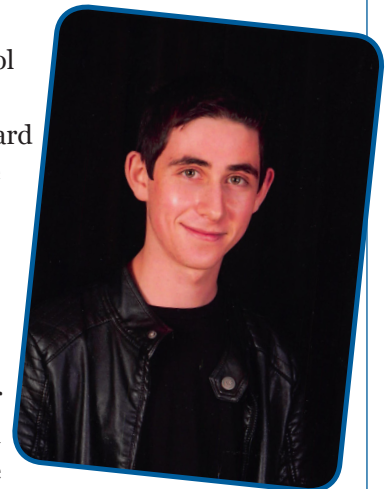
18 under 18 Award

They will be featured on the cover of the April issue of L'Chaim Magazine and the San Diego Jewish Journal, as well as, in the center spread where they will be recognized and their great accomplishments will be shared.

Ethan Hirschberg and Fletcher Block were nominated by Director of Youth Programming Craig Parks. Ethan was chosen for his outstanding work around autism advocacy with his blog The Journey Through Autism and Fletcher was chosen for his immense community building skills as the President of NFTY SoCal and his work with the San Diego Jewish Teen Initiative serving all Jewish teens in San Diego.



Jason Wexler, a Sunday School Ozer and part of the Hartman Program is also one of the award recipients. He was named one of the winners of the 2020 Peter Chortek Leadership Award from the Jewish Community Foundation of San Diego for his leadership and work in raising money for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society. He's also active in the San Diego Jewish Teen Initiative and he is very involved with JCompany's Youth Theatre program (he has a lead role in the upcoming production of Matilda in March).

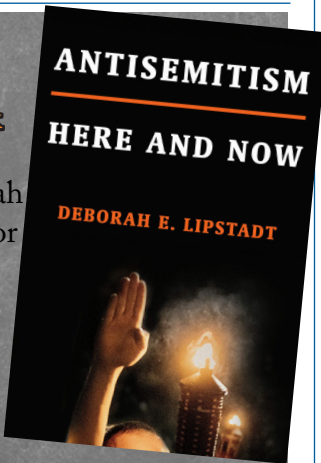

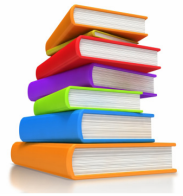

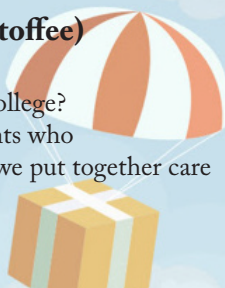
