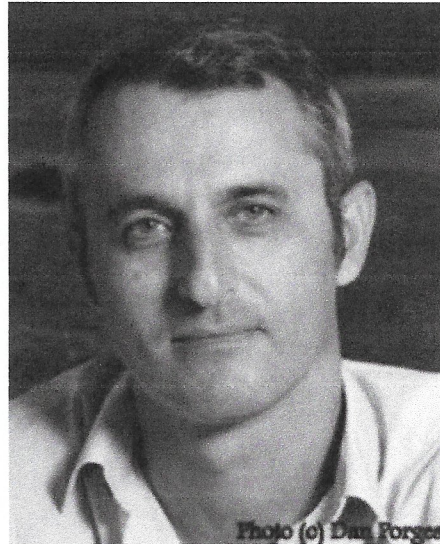


## Eshkol Nevo

Eshkol Nevo was born in Jerusalem in 1971. He studied copywriting at the Tirza Granot School and psychology at Tel Aviv University. Today, Nevo owns and co-manages the largest private creative writing school in Israel and is considered the mentor of many upcoming young Israeli writers. He has published novels, short stories and nonfiction. His novels have all been top bestsellers in Israel, and two of them, *World Cup Wishes* and *Three Floors Up*, have been adapted for the stage.

Nevo, whose novels are very successful abroad, has received the Book Publishers Association's Gold and Platinum Prizes (2005; 2006; 2008; 2011; 2014; 2015), the FFI-Raymond Wallier Prize (Paris, 2008), the ADEI-WIZO Prize (Italy, 2011) and the Steimatzky Prize twice, for *Neuland* (2012) and for *The Lost Solos* (2014). *Homesick* was a finalist for the prestigious Independent Foreign Fiction Prize (UK, 2009), *World Cup Wishes* was a finalist for the Kritikerpreis der Jury der Jungen Kritiker (Austria, 2011), and *Neuland* was included in *The Independent's* list of Books of the Year in Translation (2014).
