**Two months/two topics – Tuesday, November 20 at 7 pm will be this year’s Wayne Clergy Fellowship sponsored Interfaith Thanksgiving Service at the United Methodist Church in Wayne, 99 Parish Drive.** As we did last year, we will be inviting Christians, Muslims, Jews, Hindus and Buddhists to participate. However, this year we will endeavor to keep the service to one hour in length, which may mean that I or others who have traditionally participated each year will now take turns. This is so that we can be more inclusive while still adhering to what most consider to be a reasonable length service. (They only think it is reasonable because they have not sat through a Shabbat morning service!) We live in rather divisive times and anything that can bring diverse people together in peace and harmony is significant. Whether I am leading a prayer or not, I will be there to support this important annual gathering that I’m so glad has been returned to the Wayne Township calendar. I invite all of you to join me there. See you in church!

**December 18 will be an important date on our congregational calendar. Not because it will be two weeks after our annual congregational Chanukah candle lighting (5:45 pm on 12/4), but rather because two events that do not belong together will coincide.** Every December, Mike Greenblatt representing our Men’s Club, works with NJ Blood Services to see that we host a blood drive at a time of the year when blood supplies are traditionally very low. Often we do it on a Tuesday, when Religious school is in session in the hopes that perhaps a parent or two come donate a pint while their child is learning down the hall, both setting a good example and performing a mitzvah. The drive will take place from 2-9 pm.

This year, December 18 is also Asara b’Tevet, a fast day on the Jewish calendar. Every year on the 10<sup>th</sup> of the Hebrew month of Tevet there is a sunrise to sunset fast commemorating the siege of the walls of Jerusalem by the Babylonians back in 588 BCE. This ultimately led to the destruction of the First Temple and the sacking of Jerusalem. There are some who no longer fast on the minor fasts related to the destruction of Jerusalem since Jerusalem has been rebuilt. There are some who argue for a half-day fast, as a semi-marking. However, we are still arguing over whether there is such a thing as a half-day fast (we tend towards all or nothing). For those who are fasting, the fast begins at dawn, 5:48 pm, and ends at 5:08 pm when it is fully dark. There is special liturgy done on a fast day, but it requires at least six people fasting be present at the service.

Had we done a better job of due diligence, we would have avoided this conflict, but no one picked up on it at the time we agreed to host the blood drive. Once the conflict was realized we contacted the blood center to change the date and discovered that the only open date remaining was Dec. 24<sup>th</sup> which is not a date where we get much traffic in the building, nor could we expect others from the community to come that day. So the question became to keep or to cancel. There were advocates for both positions, but in the end I decided that hosting the blood drive on the fast day was what we should do. Why? First, we made a commitment that I think we should honor. Second, giving blood is a mitzvah and so we should provide people with opportunities to do mitzvot. Third, we typically don’t even do the fast liturgy at our services because we don’t usually have six people fasting in our community. Fourth, the fast ends in the middle of the drive, so in theory one could fast, eat, then give. If you don’t fast, like most of our congregants, or only fast for half a day, then it is over before the drive begins.

So here is my request – either fast or give blood on Dec. 18 – do one or the other; and hopefully we have more people fasting and more people giving blood than we usually do for either of these events.

## *A Word from our President* *Barry Blecherman*



Perhaps 15 or 20 years ago, Sarah and I had the opportunity to sit in someone's living room in Bergen County with nine or ten other couples and learn from Rabbi Joseph Telushkin. Rabbi Telushkin has written many books, including *The Book of Jewish Values*, *Rebbe*, *Words that Hurt*, *Words that Heal*, and *Jewish Literacy*. He was once named as one of the 50 best speakers in the United States. This night that we spent listening to him and asking him questions truly impacted our lives for the better; I'd like to share a little bit of what he told us in this issue of L'Chaim.

Rabbi Telushkin's focus that night was on creating peace of mind and happiness for oneself and one's family in the crazy-intense world of being a young parent working in the New York City area (he lives here too). He gave us three things to try to do that are each both grounded in Jewish values and universal in application.

His first piece of advice was that once each week parents should recount to each child something that he or she did that week that made their parents proud. Being a rabbi, Rabbi Telushkin suggested that a good time to do this would be at the dinner table on Friday night. Parental pride can come from your kids' academic or athletic achievements, and these are fine to use. But the rabbi suggested that pointing out your children's acts of kindness as moments of pride for you was a better mechanism for gaining *shalom bayit* (a peaceful house). Sarah and I have followed this suggestion and we believe that doing this has helped our kids' self-esteem, reinforced good decision-making, and defused some tense situations. The children look forward to Friday night dinners all the more because of this practice – when they were little we could see their faces shining in anticipation of hearing how they'd made their folks proud.

Rabbi Telushkin's second piece of advice involved that far too frequent part of all of our lives: being stuck in traffic. All of us have our traffic horror stories. My bus ride commute from the Transit Center on Route 23 to Port Authority in the city is about 19 miles – it usually takes just over an hour each way. I'm by no means unique in this – I have seen a number of you on the bus over the years. The rabbi discussed that how we internalize these times of helplessness and frustration was up to us. Rather than succumbing to road rage or exasperation, he suggested that we try to make these into times where we can increase our peace of mind. If the traffic jam is typical for the day and time then think about the construction workers working in the heat or cold or rain or snow and say a little prayer that they remain healthy as cars whizz past them. If the traffic jam is unusual for the time, day, and route and may be caused by an accident, say a prayer for those who may be hurt or scared. Will these prayers help those other people? Maybe, maybe not. But as I've remembered this advice over the years, I can report that this outward focus has helped me keep my cool and arrive at work with the composure to do my job.

For the life of me, I cannot recall the rabbi's third piece of advice. I hope that it was something like, "forgive yourself when you forget things."



## MEN'S CLUB NEWS

The program includes a Jets football tailgate party, and a session on learning how to brew beer. The hops come from our very own garden (thank you, Henry Ramer). The cost to attend is \$10. Come and enjoy the game, the camaraderie and the take-home gift – a bottle of not-yet-ready-to-drink home brew. Wait one month, and then we can all celebrate with our Shomrei Torah he-BREW.

Coming up very soon is the annual Man of the Year gala evening, at Temple Beth Ahm Yisrael in Springfield NJ. It is only two weeks away, on Wednesday November 14. Our honorees this year are Peter Whitmore, past President of Shomrei Torah, and Mandy Krieger, our Youth of the Year. Mandy was a Torah reader during the high holidays, and is a committed USYer. We look forward to honoring both of them that evening. If you have not yet signed up to attend, call the office right away or reach out to reservations chairman Rob Baron. And remember that this year, for the first time ever, your cost to attend is only \$20 if you are a first time attendee (and have never been at this gala before). It is always the largest gathering of Conservative Jews in the state, with a sumptuous cocktail hour (plan to arrive before 6pm), open bar and dessert reception.

In December, Shomrei Torah will run its annual Winter Blood Drive. Mike Greenblatt is again taking the lead on this important program. The date is Tuesday, December 18. This is one of the greatest mitzvahs you can do – giving someone the gift of life-giving blood. The hours are 3pm to 9pm and even if you cannot donate, please consider helping Mike in running the event. Volunteers are always needed to greet visitors and assist with the New Jersey Blood Services staff.

Back here at home, the Shomrei Super Bowl box pool is running again. Invest \$18 in a box – you might win big. The four prizes are \$150, \$200, \$150 and \$400. That's \$900 total – with the possibility that one person could win the entire pot, if the score does not change from the first quarter to the last minute.




