FROM THE BIMA Rabbi Randall Mark

I think that learning is an essential Jewish component. I try to study regularly not because I am a rabbi and like to study (both of which are true), but because I believe that study is one of the defining elements of what it means to be a Jew. We are the People of the Book, not just because we love to read, but because we love to learn, Torah is our book. Studying Torah can be defined narrowly to the Five Books of Moses or it can be understood more broadly to be the entire scope of Jewish learning – personally I’m a fan of the second understanding.

I promote Adult Education, on all sorts of Jewish topics. For those who like traditional Torah study, we do it weekly at 9am on Shabbat mornings before services begin. Some come just to learn, others learn first and then stay to pray. Once a month, we continue the discussion while we eat at the Shabbat Kiddush.

In February we start a course of study on the Jewish way to disagree constructively – Makhloket Matters – on Tuesday nights. It is a five part program on how to use rabbinic texts and educational videos to help us better engage in civil discourse in today’s tense political climate.

And, of course, every February we bring you Sweet Tastes of Torah – a once yearly study opportunity that I do together with other members of the North Jersey Board of Rabbis. This year our topic is Israel – another topic that can be difficult to discuss. It is based on a new book The Fragile Dialogue: New Voices of Liberal Zionism. We will gather Sat. Feb. 2nd at Temple Beth Rishon, Wyckoff, hear a keynote address by Rabbi Josh Weinberg, a leading Zionist voice in the Reform Movement, and then we will have breakout sessions to discuss specific aspects of Zionism. As always, there will be a second session with various topics by different rabbis. Come taste some Torah!

*A Word from our President
Barry Blecherman*



Tu B'Shevat, the New Year for the Trees and a focal point in modern Judaism for green, sustainable environmental policy has just passed and it may look like our congregation celebrated by cutting down all the trees on the Hinchman Avenue side of our property. As with many things, there's a back story here – one that you deserve to know.

The trees on the west side (Hinchman Ave.) of the property were dead or dying. How can such a thing happen? We asked Wayne Township about this, thinking that they had planted the trees many years ago. The town said that the trees were all on our side of the sidewalk, not the street side, and therefore were not town trees.

We spoke to the township arborist and to private companies that do arboreal work and the explanation we received is this: Because the trees grew to be entangled with the power lines, PSE&G would come periodically to trim the trees. They trimmed the street side of the trees over and over, but never the side closer to the building and parking lot. Over the years the trees became very unbalanced and unhealthy. All the arborists agreed that the trees had to come down – even the ones who didn't work for companies that would stand to make a profit from doing the work. There were a few trees that posed an imminent danger of falling on the building; one of these was so far gone that we could easily push an entire baseball bat into its dead trunk.

So the trees had to be cut down. We presented this situation to PSE&G and after some amazing negotiation with the company by some wonderful volunteers, PSE&G did the work at their cost. The timing of the work unhappily corresponded with Tu B'Shevat.

In order to reverse this anti-green event and beautify our grounds, we have already begun talking to landscapers about new plantings (further from the power wires!) and other ways to do the right thing for Shomrei Torah and the planet. If you'd like to be involved in this please reach out to me or to Henry Ramer – we'd love to have your ideas and time.

Also – let's get as big a crowd as we can for the Gala honoring Cindy Merker – this should be a great event!

Trivia question (for 50 points): Who has the longest prayer in the Torah? Who has the shortest prayer in the Torah? Hint: it's the same person. There's a great rabbinic story that tells us the answer, found in the Talmud Tractate Berakhot 34a.

Once, a student went up to lead services. The leader sang, and spoke, and sang, and spoke, keeping the people there for an almost absurd amount of time. The other students grumbled, complaining about the time. Their teacher, however, spoke back to them, "Is this any longer than the prayer of _____, who prayed on the mountain for 40 days and 40 nights?"

A few days later, another student went up to lead. This one rushed through the service, so fast that no one could keep up. The students grumbled again, and again, their teacher rebuked them, "Is this any shorter than the prayer _____ prayed, when he asked G-d to heal his sister?"

Why all the talk about prayer? It's a question we've been working on here at Shomrei Torah's Religious School. We want our learners to leave here not only being able to lead the service, not only having a background of Jewish knowledge, but also to start thinking about what it means to pray, and what it means to have a relationship with the divine.

We did that a little differently recently, using the song "Part of Your World" from Disney's *The Little Mermaid*. Is that a prayer? We debated it for a while. It turns out that the older classes did not think that it was a prayer, while the younger classes did. The younger classes thought it was a prayer because it was asking for something. The older classes didn't think it was a prayer because it was asking for too much, and little of Ariel asked for was worthwhile. It led to a great discussion, and I look forward to learning more with our students.

As always, I would love to hear from all of you. We've made some major changes this month, with other changes planned throughout the year. Please send me your comments, questions, concerns, and trivia answers. It's one of the best ways we have to make this program even better.

THE W.I.N. PANTRY LADDER OF TZEDAKAH

1. The Wayne Interfaith Network Pantry is made up entirely of volunteers. Our most basic need is for non-perishable food (regular sizes, not super sizes) and other basic necessities. Anyone who can **set aside a little time to go shopping in a supermarket** would fulfill this primary goal. From time to time Shomrei Torah sends out e-mails to the congregation with a list of needed items. Your collection may be deposited in the WIN Collection Chest which sits in the lobby at the synagogue. If you buy major amounts of items, you can call me and arrange to meet me (or a Pantry worker) directly at the Pantry or synagogue at a time of mutual convenience. Paper bags with handles, or paper in plastic are the most useful for transport.

2. We also have financial needs. If you are unable or unwilling to shop, but would still like to help, there are two alternatives available:

a) Make out a check, **payable to Shomrei Torah Sisterhood for an amount with a zero as the end number** (\$10, \$20, etc.) and send it with a note to the office requesting that it be turned into Scrip for WIN. Suzanne will take care of the rest. This makes money for Sisterhood, gives you a check as a receipt for a donation [see your accountant...] and eases the strain on WIN's budget for the Gift Cards which are given in small amounts to each client for the purchase of fresh foods. At our discretion, small amounts of Scrip are also set aside for emergency purchases on behalf of Shomrei Torah which are donated to the Pantry.

b) You can make out a check in any amount whatsoever (no need for a zero-ending), **payable to the Wayne Interfaith Network**, and send it to WIN, PO Box 3341, Wayne, NJ 07474-3341. Be sure you include your name and address. You will be sent an acknowledgement for your donation. WIN does not send solicitations, so you will not be bothered by further requests.

3. Paper grocery bags with handles or paper in plastic are constantly used throughout the year. Rather than recycle with the town, please feel free to drop off your gently used bags, neatly folded, in the WIN Collection Chest.

4. Other kinds of solicitations may also be planned throughout the year. We hope that the congregation will continue to respond generously.

All donations are deeply appreciated! We are currently servicing approximately 120 families.






