FROM THE BIMA

I recently returned from a 4-day mission as a part of an Israel Bonds Rabbinic Delegation. It is always a pleasure to be in Israel, even when tensions are high, as they are now. Israel, like America, is a country divided. It is not a coincidence that they have had five national elections in the last four years and no political party has been able to form a stable government. The current crisis is over Judicial reform. The current Netanyahu led, right-wing/religious government, claims the judiciary has too much power for a branch of government that is not elected by the people and so they have proposed judicial reforms that would curtail the authority of the courts and restructure how judges are appointed. Those opposed to the reforms take the position that it is nothing more than a power grab by the Prime Minister, who is currently under indictment and in the midst of a criminal trial, to protect himself and his political allies, who have already been convicted in court. The reforms would give the Knesset the ability to override decisions of the Israeli Supreme Court and give politicians the ability to appoint and promote judges. Opponents of the reforms fear that it is a threat to the very fabric of democracy in Israel which does not have a Constitution and with no executive branch, limited checks and balances.

Many that we met with, from all walks of life, talked about why they have been attending rallies in opposition to the reforms. Hundreds of thousands have been protesting every Saturday night. However, they all shared that they had family and friends who supported the current government and their proposed reforms, which is what makes it so difficult for everyone. Additionally, being based in Jerusalem where there has been a string of fatal terrorist attacks in recent weeks, has put people on edge. Foreigners traveling in Israel always have security with them and excellent intel, so that we know where it is safe to go and where to avoid.

We saw some amazing sights – we went to the Lebanese border where we were able to enter a Hezbollah terror tunnel. It goes down 80 feet and travers a two mile stretch from Lebanon to Israel. The IDF found and filled in six of them that they estimate had been under construction for a decade. On that same day, we also saw an Iron Dome battery that defends Israel's borders from rocket and missile attacks. We also visited Gazelle Valley Park. I had no idea that there was a nature park filled with gazelle in the middle of Jerusalem – amazing! And we visited *Ir David*/the City of David, just outside the walls of the Old City of Jerusalem. Extensive excavations are taking place and there are discoveries going back to the time of King David. Therestorations allowed us to walk the same paths that pilgrims went upon when visiting the ancient Temples.

We heard from terrific speakers talking about everything from resettlement of Ukrainians to security concerns to the current political climate. One of the benefits of a Bonds Delegation is that it is interdenominational. I traveled with Reform, Conservative and Orthodox rabbis. There are not many venues left where we all come together. So, the conversations and dialogues that took place amongst the group were valuable as well. I hope in the weeks and months ahead to be able to share the insights that I gained, and to show why in spite of everything going on in Israel, I will continue to invest with Israel Bonds, even while taking issue with decisions of the current government that I cannot in good conscious support. Israel is a complex place and simple answers don't do it justice. May we all continue to learn and support Israel.

We are all aware of the alarming rise in antisemitism in today's world, and as recently as this past weekend neo-Nazi groups declared a "National Day of Hate." Jews all over the country were vigilant, and with the help and support of local law enforcement, Jewish Federations, the ADL and other Jewish organizations, we celebrated Shabbat and spread the message #ShabbatOfPeaceNotHate.

Next week when we participate in Purim festivities at Shomrei Torah, we will be doing the mitzvah of celebrating our ability to rise above and overcome this ongoing challenge. So please, join us on Friday night at 7:30pm for Shabbat Zachor with our special guest speaker, Naomi Adler, CEO of Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America as we celebrate the 111th Anniversary of Hadassah which was founded on Purim in 1912. Wanted: Ambassadors of Welcome

We are a nation of welcomers, called to help families displaced by global strife. Unfortunately, over the past year, there have been too many of these events. Which is why the congregations of the North Jersey Interfaith Cares (NJIC), which Shomrei Torah is a part of, are again looking to sponsor a refugee family from a nation torn by war or political unrest.

Our sponsorship will NOT require financial donations, but NJIC will need donations of our time, especially when the family first arrives.

All newcomers will have gone through security and background checks conducted by the US government prior to their arrival. They will have received a series of medical exams and health screenings. They will also have work authorization and access to social security numbers and cards.

While the national origin of our specific sponsored family is yet to be determined, we wanted members of our congregation to begin thinking about what **committees** they might be able to donate a little time to, and maybe some of their expertise:

Housing—helping to find and setting up an apartment before they arrive

Transportation—helping drive adults to appointments, help them navigate public transportation

ESL—you don't need to speak the language or be accredited to help teach English

Cultural Orientation—such as helping them learn to navigate super markets or find a place of worship

Finance and Employment—such as helping craft a resume, create a family budget

Health and Mental Health—connecting newcomers to healthcare providers

Education – helping register children for school, identifying after-school programs

Community sponsorship is a vital support system for newcomer families for at least the first few months after their arrival. It brings communities closer together in the spirit of service and solidarity and allows communities to grow stronger.
