**September 19, 2023 –** *Koshersoul* by Michael W. Twitty contains essays and food/cooking info on African-American Jewish food. (4 TRL +e book + audiobook)

October 17 – *Judaism Without Tribalism* by Rabbi Rami Shapiro discusses the unity among Jewish factions and why this is important in our time. (6 TRL)

**November 21 – One Hundred Saturdays: Stella Levi and the Search for a Lost World** by Michael Frank is based on the remarkable conversations with the author over 6 years in which 99-year old Stella Levi brings to life the vibrant world of Jewish Rhodes, deportation to Auschwitz, and Stella's wisdom and resilience. (4 TRL + 4CDs + ebook + audiobook)

**December 19 – A Rosenberg by Any Other Name: a History of Name Changing in America** by Kirsten Lise Fermaglich elegantly reveals the real story of name changing by immigrants and ambitious movie stars in America. (2 TRL)

**January 16, 2024 – The Postcard** by Anne Berest is a portrait of 20<sup>th</sup> century Parisian intellectual and artistic life, an enthralling investigation into family secrets, and a poignant tale of a Jewish family devastated by the Holocaust. (4 TRL + ebook + audiobook)

**February 20 – The Color of Love** by Marra B. Gad is a memoir by a mixed Jewish/Black child adopted by a loving Jewish family on her struggles growing up in Chicago and her journey reaching out to her blood father's Jewish family. (0 TRL + ebook + audiobook)

March 19 – *The Beauty Queen of Jerusalem* by Sharit Yishai-Levi is the story of generations of unforgettable women as they forge their paths through times of dramatic change. (1 TRL)

**April 16 – Austerlitz** by W.G. Sebald is the story of a man's search into his life's central riddle; arriving in a Kindertransport in 1939 to a Welsh family he follows the trail back to the void at the heart of the 20<sup>th</sup> century to rescue his heritage from extinction. (1 TRL + ebook)

May 21 – Their is Nothing so Whole as a Broken Heart: Mending the World as Jewish Anarchists edited by Cindy Milstein is a compilation of 35 essays, many written from a feminist or queer perspective, that journey into past and contemporary trauma that are humanizing and healing. (2 TRL + ebook)
