The TBH choir, Kol Neshama, invites you to the 4th annual Shabbat Shirah kumsitz! The day marks Shabbat Shirah, the Sabbath of Song, when we read Parshat Beshalach (Exodus 13:17-17:16), the Torah portion that includes the Song at the Sea. A kumsitz (from the Yiddish “come sit”) describes gathering together to sing and socialize, either on the floor, in chairs, or around a campfire.

Bring your guitars, percussion instruments, and voices! Our focus will be to sing your favorite versions of melodies sung on Shabbat as well as your favorite Jewish and Israeli folk songs. Share with us your favorite version of L’cha Dodi or Oseh Shalom, for example. You can help teach it orally or bring songbooks and printed copies to hand out. To reduce paper copies, the choir will also have some selections projected on the overhead screen in the Social Hall. If you know in advance of a song you’d like us to sing, share the lyrics with Lydia Beth at greenacts@icloud.com and we will do our best to have them on the overhead. Most importantly of all, come even if you don’t have a song to share or think you know any. Bring yourself, your family, and friends! All levels of singing experience and knowledge are welcome. Everyone is welcome to contribute (listening and clapping count, too).



We’ll conclude our time with Havdallah led by Rabbi Goldstein and Seudat Shlishi, the third meal at the end of Shabbat. Please bring a dairy potluck item to share. Coffee, tea, and utensils provided.
