Dear TBH Friends:

As of June 1, Governor Inslee has ended the “Stay Home, Stay Healthy” order and is now focused on the four-phase “Safe Start Washington” plan. As you probably know, Thurston County is now formally in Phase 2. The Governor has issued specific guidelines for faith communities under this phase. Indoor religious services can be held at 25% capacity or with up to 50 people, whichever is less. Members would be expected to follow physical distancing and wear face masks, among other requirements.

While we look forward to gathering together in person once again, we want to do so in a way that continues to maintain the health and safety of our staff, members, and guests. The Jewish value of *pikuach nefesh*—saving a life— informs our decision-making as much as the Governor’s directive.

As of now, TBH will remain closed and all our events and programs will continue to be held virtually. At the same time, the Board is forming a COVID-19 Task Force to help us interpret how the “Safe Start Washington” plan applies to the life of our congregation. This task force will help craft guidelines and policies that will inform how and when we re-open. We will keep you informed as their work progresses!

Virtual Service and Programs—Zoom Upgrade Required

We continue to have meaningful opportunities for connection and learning online. In two weeks we will have our first virtual Shabbat Salon--“Salon@Home”—complete with a catered meal available for pickup. As of May 31st we are all required to download an upgrade to Zoom.
