Rosh Hodesh provides a fun and safe environment for girls to learn about and discuss a host of social issues they may experience, while building resilience and weaving in Jewish values.

REBUILDING/SERVICE TRIPS - Give back to a community in need. Every other year we'll organize a spring service trip open to high school age students.

OUTDOOR CHURCH - Participate in the Outdoor Church the second Saturday of every month with teens from the First Congregational church in Winchester. This organization helps homeless and street-involved men and women in Cambridge, MA.

THE DWELLING PLACE - Volunteer at a soup kitchen located at the United Methodist Church in Woburn with other TST members on the first Wednesday of every month at 5:15pm.

FOOD LINK, ARLINGTON - Help sort food, sweep and clean the facility at this food rescue nonprofit in Arlington on several Sunday afternoons throughout the year.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY, LAWRENCE - Join a building work crew once a month on Saturdays, from 8:30am-3:30pm. You must be 16 or older to participate - no experience necessary.
