Tickets for family members living at assisted-living facilities and children attending college may be requested free of charge. Children younger than 18 years of age do not require a ticket to any service. Members are also welcome to purchase a limited number of tickets for other relatives and guests at a discounted rate. For non-members, we offer a combined Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur ticket. This cost will be credited towards membership dues if you decide to join the Temple within the year. Click [here](#) for the Non-Member Ticket Request Form.

Services for children are held on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur mornings at the Temple for two different age groups. Because these are family-focused experiences, **we require that children be accompanied by at least one adult.**

- **Aleph services** are for families with children ages 5 and under. These services are a lively mix of singing, storytelling, and movement. Aleph services begin at 9 am at the Temple. Members and non-members are welcome. **Tickets are not required for children and adults.**
- **Kehillah** services, planned for families with children ages 6-10, are engaging and highly participatory with lots of music. Kehillah services begin at 10:30 am at the Temple. **Tickets are required for adults.**
