A Message from our Clergy



This year in particular, I found comfort in the many messages of the Chanukah Story.

One of the most prominent themes of Chanukah is the ongoing struggle for freedom in the face of oppression. In the case of Chanukah, the Syrian-Greeks forbade Jews to practice their religion, declaring identification as a Jew to be a crime punishable by death. The idea of a strong identity and the freedom to express it therefore became central to the theme of Chanukah.

Chanukah always falls during the very darkest nights, of the darkest season, when there is the least amount of sunlight and minimal moonlight, too. The festival comes just when we need it the most, and its light serves as an antidote to the darkness of the season. It is during this darkest window of time that we begin to light our own lights, in order to dispel the darkness. No matter how dark the world may feel, our celebration of Chanukah teaches there is always a possibility of hope and of bringing light into the world. It's a call from a friend, a gift from a neighbor, a helping hand from a stranger that can add light to the world and lift our spirits, even for just the tiniest moment.

This year, when we celebrated Chanukah, we recalled the heroism

of those who came before us, who fought and prevailed then - and now! - so that we can continue to keep the flames of our tradition burning brightly.

We are taught to place our lit *Chanukiyah* in the windows each night for the entire neighborhood to see. The goal is to publicize the miracle of the oil which lasted for 8 days in the ancient Temple. In Hebrew we call it *pirsum ha'nes*. This season, when we lit our *Chanukiyahs*, we proudly declared to all who can see: The Jewish People Live! Am Yisrael Chai!

In this tragic and devastating time, our hearts go out to all who are mourning the loss of a loved one and all who are praying for the recovery of injured family members and friends. Of course, we especially hope and pray for the safe return of the hostages held captive in Gaza: women, children, the elderly and the disabled, among many others.

We stand in disbelief at the astonishing increase in antisemitism and antisemitic hate crimes around the globe. The resurgence of the world's oldest hatred and most poisonous disease leaves us feeling frustrated and helpless. And yet, we are not alone. Please report any antisemitic act immediately. Together we will expel the darkness and proclaim this truth to the entire world: Israel has and always will be a light unto the nations, and we will continue to advocate for the Jewish homeland no matter where we find ourselves.

Accompanying our own sense of disbelief is the understandable desire to know what we can do to help, any support we can offer our brothers and sisters in Israel as they confront this tragedy and the massive war effort accompanying it.

Jan Jay was awarded with the Ner Tamid Award during this past year's Annual Meeting. The award is given to a member who volunteers their time selflessly. Below are remarks given by Rabbi Sam Trief, honoring Jan during the meeting.



The Ner Tamid, which translates as "eternal light", hangs prominently above our bima. The Torah teaches that the Ner Tamid is an essential component for a Tabernacle or our modern day sanctuary to exist.

Our tradition also reminds us that each of us has our own ner tamid, an ever-present flame for us to access when we need it most, waiting for us to bring mitzvot into the world, limitless in its capacity for kindling and sharing. So, what a fitting award to present to our friend Jan Jay, for she is an ever-present flame for our community, truly limitless in her capacity for kindling her own ner tamid and sharing it with others.

Jan is a Do-er, a Dreamer, a Supporter and an advocate. Not only has she

served our community through large and outward facing Temple Sinai groups and initiatives such as Hineini, our inclusion committee, Women of Sinai, our Board of Trustees and our Culture of Belonging Lab Team, she is constantly participating in lesser known projects that truly impact society. Whether driving for Second Helpings, or delivering machzors to members of our community who are homebound, spending the night at Sinai's Family shelter, replenishing our Shalom Station in our lobby, hosting groups at her home to make sandwiches for the sandwich project, or providing meals from Sinai to the staff at the Northside ICU during covid, she is always the first to raise her hand to help and to think of ways to contribute.

Jan is truly a leader: from her days as a TSPS parent and serving on the Early Childhood Education Committee, to creating our special needs parent group, by serving our larger Atlanta community through her leadership with the Jewish Abilities Alliance and continually working to support inclusion efforts in both the Preschool and Noar. Jan is also so committed to helping provide resources and support to parents who have children with special needs. She was the Co-Chair of Sinai T'micha, our Autism Support group, and she always assures that teachers in both the Preschool and Noar are trained to recognize the red flags for a child who might be experiencing any kind of learning difference.

Jan is an advocate for racial equity and justice in our community and served as a MitzVotes Volunteer. There are certainly things that are missing from this extensive list of Jan's contributions, and there is certainly more that she will do, but we are profoundly grateful for you Jan, and your Ner Tamid, your eternal light that you bring to all that you do for your family, for Sinai and for the Jewish world. Thank you Jan, we are better because we know you, and you inspire us to live up to our potential, Mazel Tov.

Partnering with the Community Assistance Center (CAC)

Temple Sinai has had a long standing relationship with the CAC. Our lay leaders share their experiences here.

Q: Tell us about the volunteer work Temple Sinai does with CAC.

A: Temple Sinai's volunteers come together to help in many areas of the CAC. Our energetic and dedicated committee assists in two different food pantry locations on the 1st Monday and 3rd Saturday of every month. Volunteers assist clients in shopping for food, sorting deliveries of food, stocking shelves, and more. Another initiative we participate in falls during the holiday season. Temple Sinai adopts CAC families in order to fulfill childrens' holiday gift wish lists, as well as providing grocery store gift cards to help the families with their holiday celebrations. Another touchpoint in which our volunteers make a significant contribution is tax preparation. Volunteers from our community are trained to help individuals and families in submitting their taxes for both the current and previous years. This Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program, an initiative of the IRS, is offered at the CAC to help clients get their income tax returns filed accurately and on time, ensuring all eligible tax credits and refunds, while avoiding costly preparation fees. Lastly, we hold regular drives at Temple Sinai further supporting the current needs of the CAC families. Our dedicated committee is just getting started with our CAC impact. There are many additional CAC areas in which we plan to expand our support and we are excited for the future of Temple Sinai's positive impact on our community through the CAC.

Q: What about the volunteer opportunity has been meaningful for you?

A: Spending a few hours a month helping at the food pantry organizing food donations, sorting deliveries and helping the CAC families who are facing food insecurity has been a very rewarding experience for us all. Understanding that our Temple Sinai volunteers are such an integral part in assuring these families can get the food they so desperately need is both a humbling and a heart-warming experience. Together, with volunteers from other congregations, churches and volunteer groups, we connect with each other and truly help make a difference in preventing homelessness in our community.

Another aspect of our Temple Sinai CAC Volunteer Corps that is particularly special is that our team is comprised of Sinai members between the ages of 15 - 70+! The CAC committee offers a tremendous opportunity for us to work together across generations. This is a very unique, fulfilling and wonderful opportunity awarded to volunteers on our team.

In addition, it was tremendously moving in December as we organized our second Adopt-A-CAC Family for the Holiday season. Our Sinai families signed up to provide gifts for 75 children within days! Our social hall was filled with donations of toys, bikes, scooters, diapers, baby clothes and more! This experience made us all feel both proud of our committee and also aware of the generous hearts of our congregants!



High Holy Day Food Drive Chair, Camille Lefkowitz:

Q: How much food was collected during the food drive?

A: A heartfelt thank you to those who donated generously to the Community Assistance Center during our High Holy Day food drive. We collected 8,003 pounds that will go to those in need in Sandy Springs.

Q: Tell us about your involvement with CAC.

A: I have helped with the food drive for 5 years and it has been wonderful to see the continued generosity of the congregation. Each year participation has grown and Click-a-Mitzvah has definitely made donating quick and easy. Over the years, I volunteered at the The Atlanta Food Bank, Second Helpings, Backpack Buddies and local food pantries, and I understand food insecurity can affect children and adults everyday. Any small contribution can make a difference and the CAC plays a vital role helping and supporting the Sandy Springs community. I have really enjoyed being a part of this wonderful annual event.

Spotlight on Talent Art Show



The SPOTLIGHT ON TALENT Art Show & Sale was a HUGE success!

Featured artwork, from members of both our congregation and the arts community, included paintings, fused, slumped and mosaic glass, jewelry, pottery, fiber, wood sculptures and functional ware, metal sculptures, multimedia, photography and paper sculptures. Saturday evening's event, attended by 150+ people, featured wine and a beautiful, delicious selection of charcuterie boards, accompanied by socializing and very active sales. Adding Sunday's full day of sales, Temple Sinai and the Fine Arts Committee proudly exceeded

anything we had anticipated, and sold approximately \$40,000.00 in merchandise – with more than 30% being split between the Fine Arts Committee for future projects and the Israel relief organization called Artist 4 Israel: Healing Arts Kits. Created by psychiatrists, therapists, first responders, parents and teachers, and based on a combination of cutting-edge science and on the ground experience working with Israeli children living through rocket attacks from Gaza, Artists 4 Israel's Healing Arts Kits intend to slow or stop the onset of new cases of PTSD. Available immediately, the Kits work in the critical first 30 seconds and 30 minutes when traumatic memory is permanently stored.

"SPOTLIGHT ON TALENT" took an entire year of planning, including the exceptional assistance from the Temple Sinai Staff and Clergy. As a result of such a positive outcome, the Fine Arts Committee is already



planning for the next one, when we hope to also include the works of some very talented Noar students and teens. Having just endured a week of the horrific news from Israel, all who attended showed a resilience and desire for something "normal". All through the show, clusters of both artists and buyers could be heard acknowledging the war, while concentrating on the art – much like Israelis who have dealt with life and war side by side forever.

Look forward to hearing about the next show! The Fine Arts Committee will welcome you to get involved in any capacity, and you'll be glad you did!

Immigrant and Refugee Justice Committee Update

The Committee for Immigrant and Refugee Justice has been quite busy over the past several months. We want to share with you some of the worthwhile and meaningful projects we've been working on.

During the summer we sponsored one week of camp for 200 refugee children! Temple Sinai volunteers supported the staff at Friends of Refugees at a variety of camp activities. The children loved it and so did our volunteers! It was a rewarding

and fun experience for everyone! Peter Savitz, a member of our committee, coordinated with the Afghan American Alliance of Georgia (AAAGA) to provide volunteer drivers to transport refugee boys and girls to and from a summer soccer camp. The program was sponsored by Atlanta United. The kids were thrilled to participate in this program and to play soccer, a game they all LOVE! In addition, we donated \$600 in Uber credits to the AAAGA which provided rides for Afghan families to medical and other appointments.

We are currently involved in a tutoring project at Friends of Refugees in Clarkston. Temple Sinai volunteers are working with Afghan women who were never allowed to attend school in their country. The women are illiterate in their own language and are thrilled to be in a classroom learning English!
