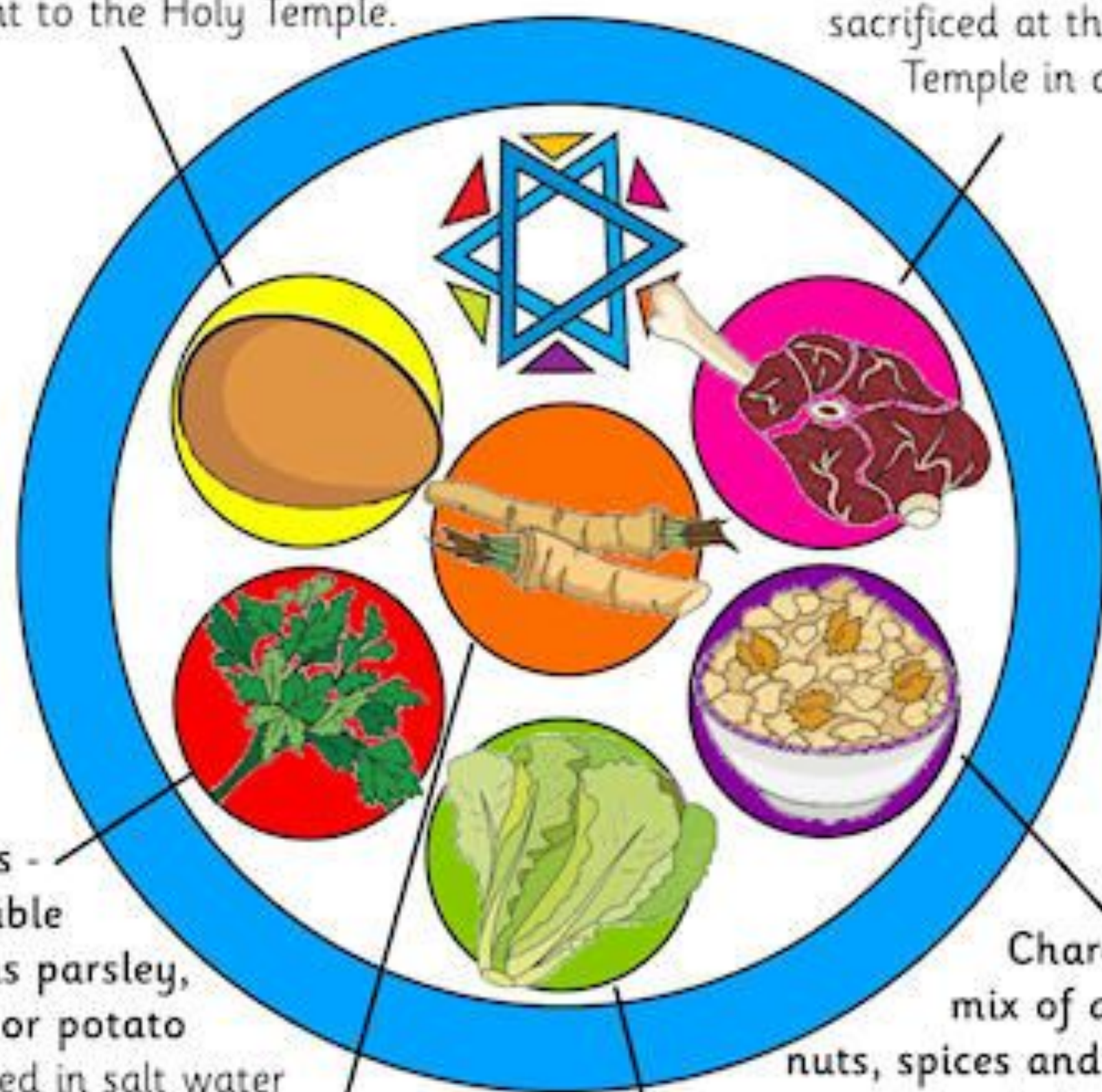

The Seder Plate

Beitzah - hardboiled egg
symbolises the festival offerings
brought to the Holy Temple.

Zeroa - shank bone
symbolises the lamb
sacrificed at the Holy
Temple in ancient
times.



Karpas -
vegetable
such as parsley,
onion or potato
is dipped in salt water
and symbolises tears.

Charoset -
mix of apple,
nuts, spices and wine
symbolises bricks and
mortar to show the
hard work of a slave.

Maror - bitter herbs
(horseradish)
symbolises the bitterness of
slavery in Egypt.

Chazeret - bitter vegetable
(celery or lettuce)
symbolises the bitterness of slavery
in Egypt.

The Symbols of Pesach - Roasted Lamb Bone



The roasted bone is called the *Pesach*. It recalls the lamb our ancestors sacrificed and ate in the days of the Temple. As a symbol on our seder plate, it reminds us that during the tenth plague, Adonai “passed over” the homes of the Israelites and spared their first born.

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The Symbols of Pesach - Matzah



We eat *Matzah* to remind us how our ancestors had to leave Egypt in such haste that the dough for their bread did not have time to rise.

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The Symbols of Pesach - Maror/Bitter Herb



We eat this *maror* to remind us how bitter the Egyptians made the lives of our ancestors by forcing them to be slaves.

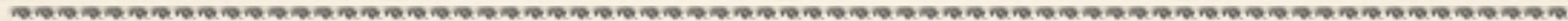
The Story starts with Questions

- Questions elicit story telling
- We ask the questions to set up the telling of the narrative of the Exodus from Egypt
- We identify the types of people at the table so we can cater our telling to the audience in a way that they will BEST UNDERSTAND THAT THIS IS ABOUT US, NOT “THEM”

Ask Questions not in the Haggadah

- Let the story of your participants be shared by asking questions/prompts that elicit conversation
- Use current events, family history, etc. to spark conversation

ORDER OF the seder



קִדְּשׁ.	Kadeish - blessing over wine
וִּרְחַץ:	Urchatz - ritual handwashing for seder
כֶּרֶפֶס.	Karpas - dipping green vegetable in salt water
יִחַץ.	Yachatz - breaking the middle matzah
מַגִּיד.	Magid - telling the story of Passover
רְחִיצָה.	Rachtzah - ritual handwashing for meal
מוֹצִיא מַצָּה.	Motzi Matzah - blessing over meal and matzah
מַרְוֹר.	Maror - dipping bitter herb in sweet charoset
בוֹרֵךְ.	Koreich - eating matzah and bitter herb
שְׁלֶחַן עוֹרֵךְ.	Shulchan Oreich - Eating the meal
צִפּוֹן.	Tzafun - finding and eating the Afikomen
בִּרְךְ.	Bareich - saying Grace after meal
הַלֵּל.	Hallel - Singing songs of praise
נִרְטָזָה.	Nirtzah - Ending the seder and thinking of the future

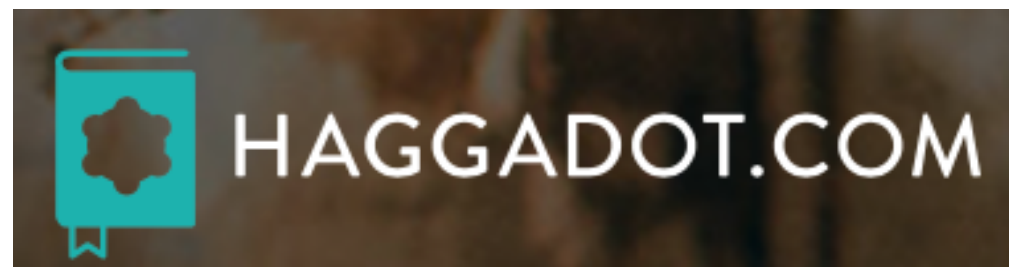
