

Monumental Language

All monuments must be approved by Swan Point and Temple Emanu-El clergy.

Swan Point Regulations:

- All monuments established on Plots are subject to the rules and regulations enacted by Swan Point ("Swan Point Regulations"), including, but not limited to, regulation of the inscriptions, images, and decorations of monuments on Plots.

Temple Emanu-El Regulations:

- The primary function of the marker is to convey religious information for future generations (Hebrew names, dates, yahrzeit, tribal affiliation).
- The secondary function of the mark is to convey the essence of a person's life.
- Only Jewish religious iconography may be displayed in the Temple Emanu-El Section*

Vertical Headstones may include but are not limited to:

- Star of David
- Menorah
- Hands (For Kohanim)
- Washing Cup or Harp (for Levi'im)
- Lion
- Deer
- Bear
- Broken Tree Stump
- Charity Box
- Books
