Led by Rabbi Alan Flam and Judy Kaye, Soulful Services encourage people to spiritually stretch - in prayer and in *t'shuvah* work (reflection). We slow down the traditional pace of prayer and focus on key prayers and themes of the Holy Days. Soulful prayer is a blend of traditional

davening, silence, chant, movement, and poetry so that our whole selves - mind, body, breath, and heart can be engaged in prayer. Drumming and guitar will accompany us in creating a joyous and reflective Soulful community. We will read and discuss the stories of Hagar, Ishmael, Sarah, Avraham, and Isaac. The Prayer for Healing and sermon/discussion will follow the Torah reading. The Soulful Musaf will focus on the U-netaneh Tokef prayer, extending and receiving blessings, shofar and concluding prayers.
