

Youth Educator

Ohev Sholom- The National Synagogue, a vibrant 300-member Modern Orthodox congregation in Washington, DC, is seeking a part-time youth educator to lead youth education for children during the week.

In this position the director will work with clergy, the youth director, and parents to deliver Jewish educational programming to meet the needs of the community. A successful candidate will be comfortable designing and teaching Jewish content to a range of students attending from public schools, Hebrew language charter (Sela), pluralistic Jewish day schools, and Orthodox day schools.

Responsibilities:

- Serve as the focal point for youth education, coordinating with the youth director, clergy, parents, and other team members to deliver Jewish education to serve the youth needs
- Design curriculum for enrichment programming for non-day school students
- Oversee and teach enrichment programming, coordinating with other staff (eg. clergy) as required
- Serve as a resource and assist youth coordinators in the creation of one-off programming related to holidays and special events
- Plan and run weekly afternoon/evening Jewish enrichment programming, such as “Shorashim” and “Anafim” for preschool through 5th grade

Qualifications:

- Bachelors degree, Jewish education preferred
- Experience working in Jewish education whether camp, school, or synagogue setting
- Experience designing a Jewish curriculum
- Experience teaching kids of various backgrounds Jewish topics
