I have discussed many of my passions from the *bimah*: Torah, Israel, and the movies. This month once again marks the culmination of all of those passions with the release of my new film


documentary, Roadmap Jerusalem.

When I finish a film, I always feel grateful for the experience. This time I feel grateful for the interviews that allowed me to better understand the archaeology of the Temple Mount, who allowed me to walk the halls of the Knesset, and who exposed me to the presence of Jerusalem throughout all of the Jewish Biblical narratives. I feel thankful for all of the professionals who felt this project worthy of dedicating time and effort to this project. I feel appreciative for Liz & Barry Bar-El who made a connection for me with the archaeologist. I feel lucky to have a wife and children and parents who are always supportive of my endeavors.

For the first time, I also feel a level of acceptance. *Roadmap Jerusalem* has received endorsements from Daniel Gordis and Gil Troy, two authors and thinkers about Israel, whom I have read and listened to for years and years. While I expect other testimonials as well, their comments (found on the website www.RoadmapJerusalem.com) are so meaningful to me as an Israel supporter.

Each time I finish a documentary, I can sit back for a moment (albeit brief) and take in the personal elements of my life that make the cut. My wife and kids are in the film again, as are my parents and siblings. Sure enough, my grandmothers stand with me in the movie as well. This time, a new character has also appeared; Adat Shalom appears in the film. This sanctuary and this community are inseparable from who I am as a Rabbi and as an advocate for Israel and Jerusalem.

I look forward to screening *Roadmap Jerusalem* at Adat Shalom on Sunday, March 11th at 7pm. I look forward to sharing this accomplishment with our community. See you there!



From the President

Many of us travel to Israel on an occasional or regular basis, and when we do, most of us visit Jerusalem to reconnect with our people's ancient capital and to feel the intense power of that connection. Modern-day Jerusalem is both magical and a reflection of unresolved conflicts and unfortunate schisms in Israeli society. Many secular Israelis are not comfortable in Jerusalem, and many Masorti and Reform Jews struggle on a daily basis to assert the rights of every Jew to pray in our most holy city and at its most holy sites.

The media narrative more often focuses on the Jewish-Palestinian struggle over Jerusalem. But I often ask myself: What will happen if the Jewish family cannot learn how to share Jerusalem between ourselves? Jerusalem has the power to bring Jews together and tear them apart. Which will it be?

I look forward to gathering at Adat Shalom on March 11th to focus on Jerusalem at the world premiere of Rabbi Lebovitz's new documentary, *Roadmap Jerusalem*. Along with his family, Rabbi Lebovitz visits Jerusalem to "recharge" every summer, and returns with renewed energy and inspiration, and this time with a documentary as well. Please join us at the film's screen debut!

Another way that we as a community have recently connected to Israel is through supporting the Israeli young adult movement, Dror Yisrael's, campaign to deliver supplies to Syrian refugees over the border to help them through the winter. This campaign, called Operation Human Warmth, is a powerful expression of strong and positive Jewish values. Despite longstanding hostilities that escalated recently following Syrian/Iranian drone incursions over Israel, this action shows compassion for Muslims and Christians in Syria who are the victims of destructive forces in their own country. In mid-February, Dror Yisrael, together with its youth movement Hanoar Haoved V'Halomed, completed the huge task of sorting

out 600 boxes of clothing and other supplies donated by Israeli Jews, Arabs and Druze for pick-up and secret delivery by the Israeli army to the refugees. While big questions remain about how Israel can forge peace with our Arab neighbors, these Israeli youth are teaching their leaders an important lesson about taking action to show compassion.

While they focused on the goods, way across the world, Adat Shalom members stepped up with donations of almost 4,000 shekels to their fundraising website for purchasing baby food and other priority items to include in their shipment. They are very grateful to us, and I am so proud to be the president of our loving and generous community that is always ready to perform another mitzvah.

Wishing all a beautiful seder gathering with friends and family at the end of this month. Next year in Jerusalem – in the meantime, March 11th at Adat Shalom for *Roadmap Jerusalem*.





Selling Hametz for Passover

A custom in preparing for Passover, in addition to cleaning your home and removing all hametz, is to sell your hametz to a non-Jew.The transfer, mekhirat hametz, is accomplished by appointing an agent (in our case, Rabbi Lebovitz) to handle the sale. This is a valid and legal transfer of ownership.

At the end of the Passover holiday (when we may again own hametz), the agent arranges to repurchase the items on behalf of the owner. If ownership of hametz was not transferred before the holiday, the use of any such hametz remains prohibited after the Passover has concluded (hametz sheavar ha-Pesach).

Instructions on how to sell your hametz will be emailed. Please complete the transaction by March 28th!

Next time you stop by the office, say hello to our newest staff member, Leslie Katzman! Leslie was born and raised in West Los Angeles. She attended Sinai Temple Hebrew School and graduated from Los Angeles Hebrew High School and Windward School in 1984. Leslie stayed fairly local and attended Scripps College in Claremont. In 1988, she graduated from Scripps and realized she had no idea what to do with her newly minted English degree, so she decided to go to vocational school. In the meantime, she was offered a job working part time with undergraduates at UCLA Hillel and part time as a Western Regional Rep for USY working on college campuses from California to Oregon to Arizona and Hawaii (although no campus visits were authorized for Hawaii, sadly).

She worked at UCLA Hillel for 18 years, in between finishing vocational school, getting married, and having kids. In 1992, she completed her courses for court reporting (also known as "stenography") and passed her state certifications. 
