From Executive Director Renalee Pflug

We Return! With growing momentum the past six months, we're returning to in-person gatherings—Kiddush lunch on Shabbat, monthly community Shabbat dinners, B'nei Mitzvot, building beautification projects, and the imminent return of Shabbaton

2022!

A few special highlights: As the High Holidays approached, we planned in-person services in the courtyard to signify a fresh beginning for a new year. Thanks to the generosity of an anonymous donor, we replaced the aging beige chairs with new, beautiful and comfortable gray chairs, 250 in all, delivered just in time for Rosh Hashanah. A supply chain miracle!

Our momentum reached a special height as we dedicated the new Torah mantles and table covers on Simchat Torah. Rabbi Lebovitz and Cantor Schatz led us in davening, dancing, and singing as donor families carried the Torahs adorned in their new 'clothes' to the courtyard and were there surrounded by the community in joy. The project was the culmination of 18 months' dedicated work by a committee chaired by Barry Bar-El that carried on undaunted throughout the pandemic.

In March 2021, Adat Shalom submitted an application for the National Security Grant for Nonprofits. Moments before sundown on erev Yom Kippur, an email arrived informing us we are the recipient of a \$150,000 grant. We are now submitting documentation for the work to appropriate authorities and anticipate installation over the next 12 to 18 months. Thank you to Janet Schulman, Sandra Kass, and Esther Margulies for your invaluable help and support in this project.

Fueling the momentum are two new rentals on the Adat Shalom campus. The first is Creative Learning Place (CLP), an educational resource that provides class discussions and cooperative learning opportunities for children who are homeschooled. CLP students and teachers meet twice a week in classrooms and the patio. The second rental is Got Game Sports Camp. The program will take place during LAUSD Winter Break, January 3-7, 2022.

Moving along, we are in excited anticipation of Shabbaton 2022 at Brandeis-Bardin Campus. Put the date on your calendars, Friday through Sunday, January 14-16, 2022. The camp is reserved, and health protocols are in place, so all we need now is YOU!

The office staff continues in high gear for upcoming programs—Sunday, December 5 is the Congregation Meeting and Chanukah Party, January 8 is Women's League Shabbat, and many more simchas.

Thank you to President Janet Schulman and the Board of Directors for your continuous support. Thank you to Joanna, Cesar, and Ian for making the impossible possible every day. See you soon!

A huge thank you goes to Erica and Ari Kopmar and Cesar Olivares for harvesting the tree.


The Torah Mantles and Bimah Covers Are Here!

Religious School Returns to Campus

One of the core values of Judaism is *Kehillah* – community. This year, the Religious School Community will gather together on four Shabbat mornings to learn and pray together. Our first R.S. Shabbat was held on October 16 in Helen's Garden, facilitated by our very own Orley Garber! Orley led families in a text study of Lech Lecha, the week's Torah portion. Each family had time to talk with each other about their origins before sharing with the group. It was fascinating to hear where each family came from and how they emigrated to America. After our learning session, the Religious School families were called up to the Torah together for an *Aliyah* to commemorate our learning experience. We are all looking forward to gathering together throughout the year for Torah study, *davening* and *schmoozing*.

Our oldest class is delving into a brand-new curriculum, designed by Rabbi Lebovitz. *Kitah Gimmel* is exploring Jewish authors the Rabbi thinks they should be exposed to, including Maimonides, Rabbi Saadia Gaon, Theodore Herzl, Elie Wiesel, and more. The discussions between the students and the Rabbi are insightful and thought-provoking. I look forward to hearing about these discussions on the ride home each Wednesday night.

Our younger classes have been learning about key Jewish principles of *kavod* (respect/honor), *ahavah* (loving others), *dan l'kaf zechut* (judging others favorably/giving the benefit of the doubt) and the importance of mitzvot. They've also been learning their *Aleph-Bet* including final letters and vowels and their colors and months in Hebrew. They are doing great!

Our Religious School continues to grow and flourish. I am looking forward to seeing all our R.S. parents and children this January 14-16 as we return to Brandeis Bardin for the Adat Shalom Shabbaton!


