If this issue of Kol HaShalom had gone to print just a few weeks ago, I would have had something very different to say. After all, I began serving this community as Senior Rabbi just this past July! Since then, I've been grateful to have stepped

into this new role, this new beginning, with seven years of experience as a member of the Adat Shalom community, serving as Torah Reader, Religious School Teacher, Rabbinic Intern, and Rabbi-in-Residence. I am even more grateful for this experience, and for the relationships I've built in our community over time, as the tragic events since October 7th have continued to unfold for Israel, for us, and for the Jewish people across the globe.

We are a proudly pro-Israel community, united in support for the State of Israel, the

New Beginnings ... Adat Shalom turns 75!

It is impossible to write this article without acknowledging the devastating events in Israel these past weeks. Everything in our community from the mundane to the spiritual has been impacted by the events of October 7th. While my article is focused on security installation, which has been in the

planning for over a year, with construction and installation in full force the past six months, the timing for completion is eerily prescient given the current situation.

The project is the result of funding from two security grants, which includes new fencing surrounding the campus, security cameras, enclosure of the trash bins, phone system, and exterior lighting. Three new gates have been installed in the interior, separating the synagogue space from other campus activities. Finally, a new 'state of the art' intercom and access control system has been installed that will require coded key fobs to enter the campus. This new system will be rolled out soon, if it hasn't already by the time you read this. Thank you to Esther Margulies for her guidance, advice and expertise throughout the planning and installation process.

We are pleased to have installed new stainless steel, commercial-grade refrigerator and freezer units in the dairy kitchen. They're gorgeous! Many thanks to the generosity of an anonymous donor and to the Adat Shalom Women's League for their donations.

And, the Social Hall has a new dance floor! The new floor, covering the majority of the room, creates a beautiful addition. A major gift from an anonymous donor made this possible. And, thank you to the Social Hall Committee, Board of Directors, and to the Israeli Dance community for their contributions. A huge thank you to the volunteers who came to install the floor on a Sunday afternoon, and again to Esther for guidance.

The most exciting among these new beginnings is the welcoming of Rabbi Miriam Potok as the Adat Shalom spiritual leader. Rabbi Potok brings a calm, thoughtful and insightful approach to the daily issues and challenges, along with her offbeat sense of humor and love of sushi, making working together exciting, productive and fun.

Adding to our new beginnings, we welcome Shira Sergant, as Communications Coordinator, and Rabbi Karen Isenberg, as Religious School Director to the Adat Shalom staff.

Michael and I were fortunate to travel to Ireland for a two-week vacation in October. I am tremendously grateful for the support of Joanna Garcia, Shira Sergant and Cesar Oliveras, who managed things beautifully while I was away. Thank you to Rabbi Potok for wearing two hats, hers and mine, providing extra support in my absence. And, an enormous thank you to Marla who valiantly kept things under her hat while I was away.

Finally, while traveling is exciting, educational, and stimulating, it is so good to come home to Adat Shalom.

Adat Shalom Refugee Support Program

People ask, "How are the refugees doing?" The short answer, things are moving along well. The Bogancha family, Andrii, Maryna and Mylana, is living in a bright two-bedroom, one-bathroom apartment in Culver City. It's a great location, walking distance to bus lines, supermarkets, a Target, Culver City High School for the daughter, Culver City Adult School for the adults and the County Library, and Andrii has his driver's license.

Now the longer answer. The Welcome Circle began under HIAS's aegis with hope but with no specific path. It's been an education. Members of Adat Shalom and Temple Akiba joined to create the Welcome Circle, the hub, seven members in all. Areas of need became the spokes of the Circle, fundraising, housing, basic needs, education, employment and more. We work together, sharing what we learn and supporting each other. The unexpected bonus, new friends.

The family's arrival date was the great unknown, and government paperwork a formidable barricade keeping them in Austria. The call came in mid-May allowing them to leave. We had to hustle. We had not settled the housing piece yet. On June 1, 2023, they landed at LAX, each with

one suitcase and a small carry on. Their 18-year-old son Alex, who lives with a family in Santa Monica, was there to meet them. Imagine the tears, the hugs, the kisses.

Almost a year ago, when the bombing began, they left Ukraine. Now a better departure. Early morning June first they traveled from a small town in Austria to Vienna, flew to Paris, had a five hour lay-over at Charles De Gaul

Airport and finally boarded a flight to Los Angeles. HIAS provided an Air B and B for their first weeks.

This phase is complete now. They have a permanent address, Social Security numbers, government social services, medical connections, ESL classes, are learning to use public transportation, and much more. The next phase is

employment. Andrii, an attorney in Ukraine, had a side business as well, building swimming pool complexes. He is ready to become independent. Maryna continues to manage a Kharkiv children's music school online. Mylana begins high school with the new semester. The Welcome Circle continues its work.

The format of our Religious School changed a bit this year. Nearly every month, the students and teachers meet on a Shabbat to learn together in addition to Sunday sessions.

Building relationships and strengthening our community is central to Adat Shalom. When our students and their families come to learn with one another, participate in the Shabbat service and stay to eat bagels, we are all blessed and get to experience the beauty of watching our youth learn and practice Jewish traditions. Community and Commitment

As the new director of the Religious School this year, I feel truly blessed to be part of the Adat Shalom community. Being new to Adat Shalom, I was welcomed in so warmly, with open arms, by everyone I've met. I've gotten to know many members here—both from the Religious School and from the general membership. Aside from the warmth and heimish-ness I've encountered here, I've found the synagogue to exemplify a sense of community and commitment to Jewish traditions and values.

In the V'ahavta, the paragraph we recite after the Sh'ma (from Deuteronomy 6:5-9), we are told "V'shinantam l'vanecha"—You shall diligently teach your children. I take this mitzvah very much to heart, as I believe many of you do as well. This commandment can be read both

specifically and in general. If we have our own children and grandchildren, it is our responsibility to educate them as to the customs, traditions, knowledge, and values of our people. But in a broader sense, it is incumbent on all of us to assume this responsibility. All Jews are considered "b'nei Yisrael," children of Israel. By supporting Jewish education in our community, we can all participate in this important mitzvah. The Talmud also underscores this directive in saying "Kol Yisrael arevim zeh bazeh"—All Jews are responsible for one another.

I'm very excited about all the meaningful learning going on in our Religious School. We are blessed with wonderfully knowledgeable and talented teachers and the opportunity to share music and song with the inspirational Cantor Dale. It's gratifying to see our Religious School students so eagerly learning and embracing their Jewish heritage. Our areas of focus are Hebrew, prayer, knowledge and customs of holidays and Shabbat, Torah, and Israel. We begin each Sunday session in song with a Havdalah service, acknowledging the separation of Shabbat from the other 6 days of the week. And we conclude our learning day with song and the singing of Hatikvah. I am grateful for the opportunity to contribute to the continuation of Judaism into the next generation and beyond.


