Tot Shabbat - Weekly services for children ages 5 and under.

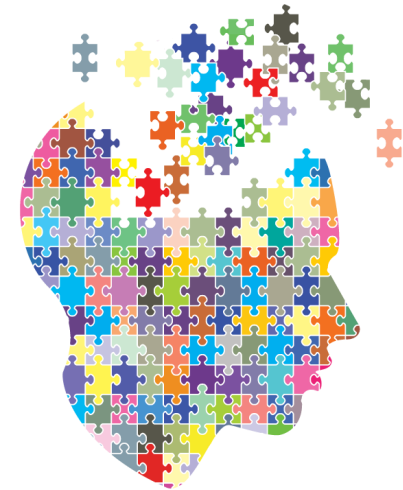
