I urge you to come and support our wonderful group of teens. They provide such hope for the coming generations in their intelligence and commitment. They deserve the support of congregation members beyond their parents.

On Saturday night we will be having our Tikkun L'eil Shavuot. We will begin to gather at 6 PM and have a vegetarian/dairy potluck dinner. We will then have a short service. After that we will begin an evening of study (with breaks for ice cream). 

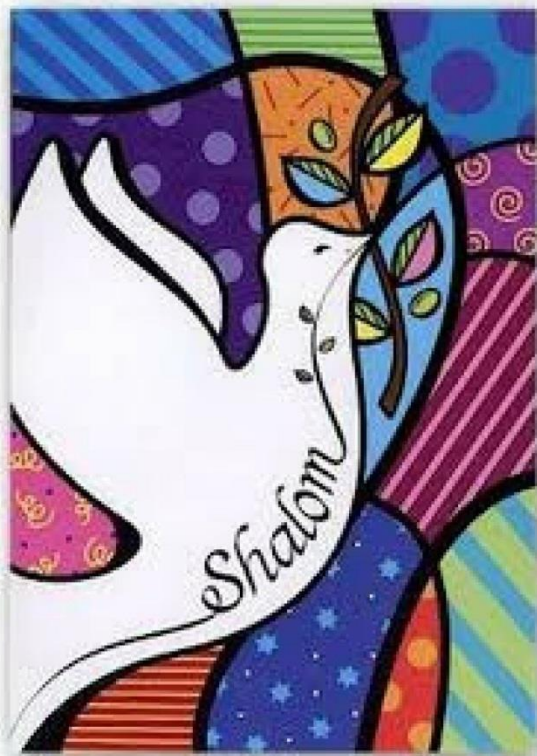
