Rabbi's Message

Rabbi Dr. Moshe Sokol

Every year we assemble to mark the completion of Nach, but this year is different. Now this year is a true celebration! A sumptuous feast to mark

the occasion, accompanied by good spirits and good cheer.

What better way is there to bring our community together than over Torah? We read in parashas Yisro that Bnei Yisrael travelled from Refidim "and they came to the Sinai desert, and camped in the desert, and Yisrael camped there opposite the mountain." (Shemos 19:2) Not only does the Torah repeat their having encamped, but if you look at the original Hebrew you'll note that while the first iteration uses the plural for encamping, the second iteration uses the singular. Why the repetition, and why the switch from plural to singular?

Apparently in answer to these questions, Rashi famously comments that once they encamped, they did so "as one person, with one heart." The prospect of receiving the Torah united the Jewish people then, and it does so today as well.

When we as a community all join together to undertake the massive task of completing Nach we are united in purpose and

goal, united in prioritizing the study of Torah that guides our life and shapes our values.

The Yavneh Minyan is about many things, but it surely is also about limmud Torah, and this grand effort epitomizes that aspiration.

I'd like to thank Michael Klein, who year in and year out organizes the program, and goads us all into undertaking our portion of Nach. He is our inspiration, leader and guiding light, and without his determination we would never accomplish this great task.
