FROM RABBI HAYON



I am deeply thankful to those who have served over the past year, and I am eager and excited to begin my partnership with the new crop of volunteer leaders whose terms begin this month.

At the end of this month, our congregation, along with synagogues all over the world, will celebrate the festival of Shavuot. This joyous festival originally commemorated the beginning of the springtime harvest in antiquity.

However, over the centuries that have passed since the destruction of the ancient Temple in Jerusalem, the holiday came to assume a new layer of religious significance. Today, Shavuot is the time at which we celebrate the giving of Torah on Sinai and give thanks for the ever-new gift of study, discovery, and enlightenment.

As part of the festival worship service on Shavuot, we read a selection from the biblical Book of Ruth. This text is prescribed for reading and study on Shavuot in part because the story is set during the barley festival in the biblical territory of Judah, which fell during the springtime of the year. The most familiar and beloved moment in the Book of Ruth arrives when Ruth, a non-Jewish Moabite widow, affirms her choice to become (and remain) a part of the community of Israel. Resisting her mother-in-law Naomi's urging to return to her homeland in Moab, Ruth cries out passionately: "Do not urge me to leave you!... Wherever you go, I will go; wherever you lodge, I will lodge. Your people shall be my people, and your God shall be my God." [1:16]

Over the years, these lines from Ruth have become

All of these individuals who have stepped forward into leadership have done so as an expression of their willingness to assume responsibility and stewardship for our synagogue, its resources, and its





BOOK REVIEW (digital)

More Than I Love My Life by David Grossman **THURSDAY, MAY 11, 7:00 P.M.**

More Than I Love My Life, by author David Grossman, is the story of three strong women: Vera, age 90; her daughter, Nina; and her granddaughter, Gili, who is a filmmaker. A bitter secret divides each mother and daughter pair. They travel together to Goli Otok, a barren island off the coast of Croatia, where Vera was imprisoned and tortured for three years as a young wife after she refused to betray her husband and denounce him as an enemy of the people. This unlikely journey – filtered through the lens of Gili's camera, as she seeks to make a film that might help explain her life – lays bare the intertwining of fear, love, and

mercy, and the complex overlapping demands of romantic and parental passion.

Emanu El Young Professionals Visit New Orleans

In March, a group of twelve Emanu El young adults traveled to New Orleans on the second annual Young Professionals Southern Jewish Heritage Trip. The group was led by Rabbi Fixler and Becca Schwartzberg, our Youth and Young Adult Engagement Coordinator, and was made possible by the generous support of the Robert Reichek Youth and Young Adult Engagement Fund.

For three days, this group of enthusiastic travelers experienced all the Crescent City had to offer: from beignets to a Voodoo tour (with a real Voodoo priest) to street corner jazz. Highlights of the trip included a Jewish walking tour of the French Quarter, a visit to the new Museum of the Southern Jewish Experience, and Shabbat services at the historic Touro Synagogue.

Participants raved about our Friday night dinner at Saba, the restaurant of famed Israeli-American chef, Alon Shaya. Everyone enjoyed our Shabbat morning Torah study, where we sat in Lafayette Park and Rabbi Fixler connected the sacrifices described in Leviticus to the story of the Jewish family who took in and nurtured a young Louis Armstrong. We concluded Shabbat together

with a Havdalah service at Woldenberg Riverfront Park on Saturday evening, where we prayed together as we took in the sights and sounds of the steamboats traveling down the Mississippi River.

The goal of this annual trip is to connect young adults with each other, with their congregation, and with the unique story of southern Judaism. We are so grateful for the support from the Reichek Fund, which makes it possible to ensure that the cost to participants remains accessible. 


