FROM RABBI HAYON



What is clear, I hope, is that the State of Israel will build a future of safety, security, and prosperity with the support of its international allies and the steadfast devotion and solidarity of the worldwide *Iewish* community.

I write these words during an excruciatingly painful time in the life of the State of Israel and of the Jewish people. Israel is currently reeling from a devastating and gruesome attack unleashed upon her by Hamas terrorists who infiltrated the Jewish state from the Gaza Strip.

Details are still filtering out slowly, but what is clear at the time of this writing is that the horrors and suffering our people endured during this attack were second only, in volume and in brutality, to the days of the Holocaust. Our brothers and sisters in Israel, our family and friends, are suffering mightily.

We do not yet know what will happen next, although by the time you read these words, much more will undoubtedly have become clear. The Israeli military will certainly plan swift and decisive operations of reprisal against the extensive terror infrastructure built and maintained by Hamas in Gaza. It is still far too early to know how this bloody chapter in Israel's history will end.

Since I cannot write about how the current operation in Gaza will end, I'd like to write instead about a moving and inspiring figure from the end of Israel's last significant and prolonged military conflict in Gaza. This battle took place in the summer of 2014 and was known as Operation Protective Edge.

You may remember the conflict as another violent and deadly conflict for both Israelis and Palestinians. It lasted

about six weeks and finally drew to a close with a cease-fire declared on August 1, 2014. The last Israeli killed in Operation Protective Edge was a young Israeli soldier named Hadar Goldin, who was a 23-year-old lieutenant in the IDF when he died. Tragically, Hadar's death came in an ambush waged two hours after the cease-fire was officially declared. His body was seized by Hamas and carried into Gaza. His remains were never returned to Israel for a proper burial.

I think about Hadar often. The reports about his young life testify to a spirit of joy and kindness that inspired and encouraged all who knew him: family, friends, and colleagues. But what stays with me about Hadar's story is a small detail about his military equipment.

Before reporting to duty, Hadar asked his mother Leah to teach him to embroider two Hebrew words on the strap of his rifle: "oz ve-anavah," which means "courage and humility." For Hadar, the combination of these two virtues exemplified the moral and patriotic standards to which he aspired. For us today, struggling to find our way toward the resolution of yet another deadly entanglement between Israel and her neighbors, the combination of oz and anavah remains critically important.

Israel must act courageously. Her leaders, her soldiers and her civilian population must be prepared to make difficult decisions. The willingness to undertake missions that are difficult, and at times deadly, in order to preserve the safety of the Jewish state requires bravery and resourcefulness. Israelis will be asked to sacrifice a great deal in order to bring this conflict to a successful and permanent end – and it will be incumbent upon us in the diaspora Jewish community to provide Israel with material and moral support to enable her to succeed.

And Israel must also act humbly. Though the Israeli national character is built upon independence and rugged individualism, Israel should not hesitate to turn to her closest international allies, particularly the United States, for support and assistance. No nation requires another's permission to see to its own self-defense, but maintaining a healthy sense of humility and working in close consultation with its partners in North America and Europe will help ensure that Israel's long-term self-defense strategy will be successful and sustainable. Most importantly, perhaps, the IDF must act with humility on the battlefield to avoid being drawn into bloodthirst or sadism.

While writing these words in mid-October, I don't know how the current operation in Gaza will end. It's entirely possible that by the time you are reading them in early November, the answer will still remain unclear and unresolved. What is clear, I hope, is that the State of Israel will build a future of safety, security, and prosperity with the support of its international allies and the steadfast devotion and solidarity of the worldwide Jewish community. May this peaceful future be built solidly on a foundation of courage and humility, and may it be a source of strength and inspiration for us all.


Memorial Plaques from Original Memorial Wall Available for Pickup November 13 – 16




The Assignment by Liza Wiemer Thursday, November 9, 12:30 p.m.






Becker School

Changes to Medicare Prescription Drug Plan (PDP)

ATTENTION SENIORS: Your current PDP sponsor will provide you with an Annual Notice of Change about your current prescription drug plan for 2024. Review that Notice, which describes changes in your Plan, including changes to the premium, co-pay, and the drugs covered. If you are satisfied with the changes and want to remain in that Drug Plan, you do not have to do anything to stay in that Plan for 2024. However, if your current plan will be discontinued or merged with another plan for 2024 or if you are in doubt as to whether or not your current plan is the best plan for you, you may want to review your options before accepting that change or staying with your current plan. **You have from now until December 7, 2023, to make changes to your Medicare Prescription Drug Coverage.** To change your



Prescription Drug Plan, you must sign up by **December 7, 2023.** The change will be **effective January 1, 2024**. If you want to review your current Part D plan, the Emanu El Social Action Committee will provide a trained volunteer to assist your analysis of alternatives. If you know how to contact the person who helped you in the past, please contact them directly. If you are not sure and/or would like a volunteer to contact you between now and **December 7, 2023**, call Cynthia Pleason at 713.855.9260 and leave your name, phone number and email address and you will be contacted to

schedule a convenient time to assist you.

When contacted by a volunteer, you will need to have the following information available:

- 1. Your MyMedicare username & password (If you do not have an account, you will need to create one. The volunteer can provide assistance if needed.)
- 2. Your Medicare Card (Medicare number and the date enrolled in Part A & Part B)
- 3. Your drug list: name, dosage and frequency of each medication
- 4. The name of your current insurance plan, if any
- 5. The name of your preferred pharmacy
- 6. Your zip code

Do not wait until the last minute to make your call. If you want to sign up for a Medicare Part D (drug) plan for the first time, you will need to create a personal account at www.mymedicare.gov. Call Cynthia Pleason at 713.855.9260, and a volunteer will assist you in setting up your account.




