Scholarship for Summer Programs in Israel

Temple Sinai is offering scholarships for approved programs in Israel. This program is effective from September 2016 through August 2021. A one-time \$1,000 total scholarship will be provided to any teen of Temple Sinai member/s for an organized group trip to Israel, regardless of Madrichim or Kesher participation.

- Any teen of Temple Sinai member/s who attends at least 70% of Kesher classes will receive \$1,000 per year for a possible total of \$3000.
- Scholarships may be used only for an approved organized group teen trip to Israel.
- The amount will be paid directly to the sponsoring organization of the trip upon acceptance of the teen to the program. Funds will not be released directly to the family.
- The accumulated amount of \$1000 - \$3,000 may be used up through 12th Grade.

How to Apply:

Temple Sinai participates in the community wide “Freddy Fund” Application process for these scholarships. The application process includes an eligibility review for other funding sources via the Rochester Jewish Community Federation, Farash Foundation and Jewish Family Services.

Q & A

1. When does the scholarship program take effect?

The scholarship program takes effect beginning with the 2016-2017 school year and is not retroactive.

2. What happens to the scholarship plan of a student who attends Kesher in 8th and 9th Grade but then “drops out?”

The student will receive \$1,000 grant for participating in a qualified trip.

Students will need to complete three years in Kesher (through Confirmation) in order to receive the full amount of \$3,000.

3. What happens to the scholarship plan of a student who attends Kesher in 8th; “drops out” in 9th; and comes back for Confirmation class (10th Grade)?

The student will receive a total of \$2,000 grant with a stipulation that he/she will complete a self-study, provided by Ilan Adar and/or Pauline Rosenberg, that will include the curriculum covered in 9th Grade.

4. What will be the scholarship plan of a student who attends Kesher in 9th and 10th Grade?

The student will receive a total of \$2,000 grant with a stipulation that he/she will complete a self-study, provided by Ilan Adar and/or Pauline Rosenberg, that will include the curriculum covered in 8th Grade.

5. Will a student attending a post-Bar/Bat Mitzvah program at TBK and/or TBE be qualified for this scholarship plan?

No, this scholarship only applies to attendance at Temple Sinai.

6. Can the scholarship be used for a qualified trip between 12th Grade and college?

Yes. Students remain qualified through the summer after completion of 12th grade.

7. Can the scholarship be used for attending a qualified program during a pre-college gap year/semester in Israel?

Yes, if the gap is the immediate year after completion of 12th grade.

8. Will any teen of Temple Sinai, regardless if they attended Kesher or not, be eligible to receive a grant to attend a pre-college qualified program during a qualified gap year/semester in Israel?

Yes. However, if the teen did not attend Kesher, the grant will be limited to a maximum of \$1,000.

9. When does the scholarship program end?

The scholarship program is effective through the summer immediately after the 2020-2021 school year.
