DON'T STOP US NOW!

It is hard to believe that it is 2023; three years since the pandemic began. I remember walking into Temple right after we shut down to get a few things from my office. It was so quiet. Dark. Still. So unlike our Temple Israel. We prayed we would be back together soon. It took longer than we hoped, but we are back, we are busy, and we are loving every minute!

This January and February we have so many exciting programs happening both inside and outside of Temple. Our teens are headed up North for their annual ski trip with Rabbi Jen Lader. Learn about Tu B'shvat with Rabbi Jen Kaluzny at a professional wine tasting experience at Plum Market. Don't miss Shabbat Shira to hear the most beautiful music as we celebrate the annual commemoration when the children of Israel crossed the sea. There are programs and lectures and concerts oh my! So don't stop us now, because we are having a good time!

"Don't stop us now" is also the theme of this year's adult Purim spiel on March 6th. If you haven't been to one of our adult spiels, you have been missing out! Basically, it is a no holds barred musical extravaganza, megillah reading, joke making evening topped off with good food and better desserts. [Our kids' spiel is just as fun! Bring your kids and grandkids!]

This year, the story of Purim hits even closer to home than usual. It is an all too familiar story of how Jews are made out to be the 'other', and are threatened with extermination. The Jews of the time posed no threat to anyone, and there is no reason given aside from having their own customs, and their refusal to bow to anyone but God. For that alone they are targeted for death. What saves them, or better who saves them, is one brave woman, supported by one brave man. Esther carries out the advice of Mordechai, and also acts upon her own instinct to protect her people even at cost of putting her own life in peril.

We are living in a world that is not all that dissimilar from Persia in the time of King Achashverosh. There need not be much explanation for hate, and there is no mass outcry pushing back on the threats against us. So what must we do? We must all dig deep and discover our inner Esther and our inner Mordechai. We must say loudly and proudly: nothing will stop us now, because Am Yisrael Chai! The People of Israel live! We have lived for thousands of years, and we will live for thousands more, despite the threats against us. Haman has come and gone in many forms, and still, we are here.

What keeps us together is our devotion to our congregations, communities, our families and the state of Israel. Esther and Mordechai chose not to separate themselves out from their people and say: save me! Just the opposite. Esther put herself directly at the center and said: I am Jewish, I am facing extermination. My people are in danger. We must do the same. We must put ourselves in the center of each of our Jewish universes and fight back from there, and declare that we have never stopped, we won't stop, and we will always be proud of who we are.

In 2023, come join us to feel the warmth of community, and to eat, drink and play. Come join us to laugh and learn. Bring your babies, your teens, your neighbors and friends. Join us at Temple Israel to show the world that the Jewish people are not just surviving, but thriving, and we will continue to thrive now and forever.

MESSAGE FROM OUR LEADERSHIP



Friends -

Your involvement with Temple Israel has been a blessing for our congregation and the Temple community. We trust that having Temple Israel as your religious home enriches your life as well.

This coming fiscal year (which begins on April 1, 2023), we are introducing an 'Annual Commitment' model for membership that replaces the traditional 'fair share' approach with a self-determined gift from each household to support our annual operating expenses.

This process does the following:

- Allows members to set a commitment amount annually knowing that circumstances may have changed over the prior year.
- Creates a separate membership track for suggested commitments for single-adult and dual-adult households.
- Provides congregants with a platform to determine the frequency and timing of not only their billing, but if they so choose, when during a given year that their ACH and credit card payments are processed.
- Eliminates the challenging, impersonal process for working with Temple on getting a reduction in your membership.
- Adds the ability to opt into Brotherhood, Sisterhood and/or ARZA membership alongside synagogue membership – a one stop shop!
- Establishes new giving levels at beyond and above the suggested contribution.

What can you expect? In late February, you will receive a packet with a cover letter. The cover letter will contain what you had previously contributed with our hopes that if able, you will denote in the packet attached that you would increase your commitment to the synagogue.

To help ease the transition, I will be hosting a pair of Zooms on **Wednesday, February 8 at 1:00pm and 7:00pm** where members of our congregation can get a glimpse at the annual commitment packet, ask questions and more. 



In Review: Sisterhood Brings Greenhouse to Life for ECC - Temple Israel's Sisterhood has tirelessly raised funds and awareness for an amazing educational greenhouse called *Fruit of our Hands*. This beautiful space has been "cultivated" by Jay Mellin and amazing volunteers from the TI Sisterhood. The greenhouse will provide endless learning opportunities for all children in our program. For example, *Sh'mirat Ha'adamah* (protecting the earth) is an important Jewish value—and one that we can share with our students when we spend time weeding, turning the earth, putting seeds or plants in the ground and taking care of them. *Tikkun Olam* (repairing the world) is another important Jewish value we teach. By donating the food that we will harvest to those in need, our students will have real life opportunity to practice this Mitzvah. The greenhouse is a hands-on experience that we hope will encourage a deeper connection to the many Jewish holidays that celebrate trees and the food they provide for us.

The students in the early childhood center had been anxiously awaiting their first visit, which took place on Tuesday, November 29, 2022. They learned how to start plants from seeds, and will now have the opportunity to watch their plants thrive and grow throughout the winter and spring.






