TOGETHER THROUGH ALL KINDS OF WEATHER

Last month I took part in security training for clergy at the JCC. As I hugged and shook hands with my fellow masked "clergy in arms", many of whom I hadn't seen up close in years, the verse from Proverbs came to mind, or at least the one that has made it into the modern vernacular, "we stick together through all kinds of weather." Many congregations engage in self-defense training to prepare for events like the one in Colleyville, so it was reassuring to see the community gathered as one. After all, Rabbi Charlie Cytron-Walker credited this training with saving his life and the lives of two other people. But the threat to the Jewish community deserves our attention because it concerns everyone.

In the past decade alone, acts of bigotry and violence against Jewish people have rebounded with an unparalleled fervor not seen since the second world war. Cemeteries are desecrated; synagogues firebombed. A French student is beaten on the subway for speaking Hebrew; a London rabbi is hospitalized after being assaulted by two young men yelling, "Kill the Jews!" A mob of more than three hundred protesters encircles a Parisian synagogue chanting, "Jews, get out of France!" In Europe especially, hostility towards Jews seems to be increasing as the cultural memory of the Holocaust recedes.

This resurgence of antisemitism, the world's "oldest hatred," hasn't gone unnoticed in the Jewish community. In the words of the Haggadah, recited each year at Passover, "Not just one alone has risen against us to destroy us, but in every generation, they rise against us to destroy us." The Holocaust was only the most horrific in a long line of attempted exterminations of the Jewish people going back three thousand years.

America was supposed to be a reprieve from that, a place where Jews could flourish without fear of being persecuted or murdered. But recent events suggest the U.S. is tragically unexceptional, that we're not immune to the anti-Jewish hysteria that has seized seemingly every region of the world at one time or another.

What does Rabbi Charlie Cytron-Walker tell American Jewry in the face of that? "It's safe to go to shul." This mentality and resolve keep American Jews returning to their synagogues, especially after antisemitic attacks. Rabbi Cytron-Walker also expressed that he was not going to let the incident and anti-Semitism prevent him from wearing his kippah, "I continue to wear my yarmulke proudly. It's up to you. And I would hope, and I would pray that we're able to get past the sense of fear."

The climate of fear in which American Jews are now living receives little attention online or in the media, partly because of stereotypes of Jews as being privileged and therefore free from oppression.

This is dangerous for several reasons: first, because it's misleading, a mirage — no amount of money could save even the wealthiest Jews in Eastern Europe from being stripped of all their possessions. But second, and most importantly, because the perception of monolithic Jewish privilege feeds into the conspiracy theory at the heart of antisemitism, which alleges that Jews control Hollywood, the media, and the world's wealth.

It was this pernicious myth of the all-powerful Jew that drove 20th-century pogroms in Russia and Poland; that provoked white nationalists, chanting "Jews will not replace us," to march in Charlottesville; that compelled a terrorist — convinced that rabbis have the power to release someone from prison — to hold members of a Texas synagogue hostage for 12 hours this past January.

Today, no one needs to command us to remember that we are again at risk. One wants to know who the enemies are and how dangerous they pose. Haman's wicked designs are transparent in the Purim story, and his downfall is swift. Neither seems to be the case right now.

So, yes, we must embrace enhanced security measures. We must also embrace the values that have sustained our community throughout history by welcoming and encouraging a robust return to being in-person together in our sacred spaces. At Temple Israel, the holidays of Purim and Passover over the next two months will be no exception.

WE WILL have our lively celebrations of Mordechai and Esther's triumph over Haman, the quintessential "enemy of the Jews." Join us live and in-person on Sunday, March 13th, for our Family Purim Carnival and Spiel, which will begin at 9:30am and carry us through the early afternoon. And for some much-deserved grown-up revelry, our Adult Purim Spiel returns on Wednesday, March 16th at 7pm. (Pg 4-5)

WE WILL have our long-established 2nd night Temple Israel Seder on Saturday, April 16th at 5:30pm, led lovingly by your clergy after the two-year hiatus the pandemic has imposed – Dayeinu! (Pg 7)

WE WILL continue our efforts to educate, empower, and stand up for Israel with our TI4Israel series that will culminate with our special guest speaker, Noa Tishby, author of *Israel: A Simple Guide to The Most Misunderstood Country on Earth*, who will inspire us to be champions for our homeland on May 16th as we come together in our social hall. WE WILL come together to reconnect, recharge, and renew our souls by celebrating and worshiping in our beloved temple.

We live in times when we must again protect ourselves from those who would do us harm as Jews. In that sense, we might say that Amalek's descendants are still present in the world.

But, as Rabbi Cytron-Walker implores, we must not let the actions of the relatively few hate-filled people overtake the values of opening our doors and gathering as a community that lies at the very heart of Jewish life. Let us be safe but let us not let the hate-mongers rob us of what we most cherish. Let us not fail to remember and celebrate that which is sacred, precious, and life-giving for us.


