OUR PRESIDENTS

If you are concerned that this column will be focused on our present President or possible candidates in the future, relax. Enough with politics for a moment. Of course, having just celebrated my 78th birthday I will leave it to you to decide whether a Rabbi should take a test at any specific age to serve.

There is an office of president that I would like you to consider today, as we are about to transition to a new Temple Israel president. During my 52 years at Temple, I have served with many officers and have been impressed by the commitment, devotion

and wisdom of those who have led our congregation. During my years in this community, I have great respect and admiration for the number of men and women who devote endless hours to leadership and service.

Consider for a moment the journey to the office of president of Temple Israel. Most often the first step is the Board of Trustees and then the Executive Committee. Every president of our congregation has spent years leading to the moment when they are installed. When in this office, they will attend our Tuesday morning staff meeting in addition to numerous board meetings, executive and committee meetings.

Why become a Temple Israel president? In my experience the decision is guided by a determination to help shape the future of the Jewish people and strengthen our congregation. There are presidents who have devoted their two years with focus on Jewish education. There are presidents who worked to build our physical structure, which involves design and fundraising. There are presidents who were in the role when paying bills was easy, others faced the challenge of economic crisis. There are presidents whose goal was engagement of the congregation in important issues. The list is endless, but what unites these leaders is the desire to bring Judaism into each of our homes and to remind us how fortunate we are to be the inheritors of a long and beautiful history.

Our Temple Israel presidents work in partnership with clergy and our professional team. It is not easy to be a leader of a Temple. It is not easy to be a member of the clergy. Remember, our president is a volunteer. Each of us who are clergy; studied, were ordained and were hired by a congregation led by a president. Fortunately, our Temple Israel presidents were talented; creating an outstanding professional team, ready to listen and lead.
