By the time you read these words, I will have returned from a short trip to our “sister” cities of Nof HaGalil, Migdal HaEmek, and the Jezreel Valley in the lush Central Galilee. I serve as your emissary and an active member of the Jewish Federation’s Partnership Committee. Our role is to provide oversight of and guidance to the many programs supported by funds allocated from the Israel and Overseas committee at JFMD. It is an honor to do so...and a joy to finally return to the Land of Israel (even if for just a short journey).

As I consider the separation I feel from my homeland, I am reminded of the words of Psalm 137, “If I forget thee, O Jerusalem, let my right hand forget her cunning.” It is my sincere hope that my trip is a sort of “opening of the flood gates” for Temple and our return to Israel. After two years of separation, we are leading a return to the Holy Land for our congregation and community. In Review: **Passover Seder with Governor Whitmer** - In her role as the co-chair of the Coalition for Black and Jewish Unity, Rabbi Marla Hornsten led a Passover Seder hosted by Governor Gretchen Whitmer. It was the first seder to be held in the Governor's residence, which was attended by the executive committee of the Coalition, the Governor and Senators Jeremy Moss and Marshall Bullock. Highlights included a heartfelt rendition of "Go Down Moses" sung by Reverend Michael Kennedy, a reading of Maya Angelou's powerful poem "I Rise" by Reverend Robyn Moore, the blessing over the 1st cup of wine by Temple Member and Executive Director of the ADL, Carolyn Normandin, and of course, the 4 Questions chanted by Temple Member, Benji Stern. In these times of rising anti-Semitism and racism, it was an incredible place to celebrate the seder with the Passover themes of freedom, inclusion, equity and faith. Governor Whitmer commented as the seder came to a close: "This may have been the first seder here, but it will certainly not be the last." We look forward to "Next Year in Lansing!"

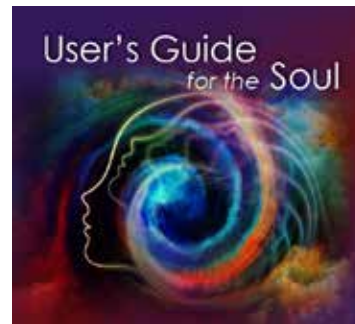

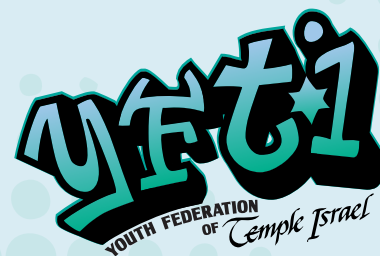
